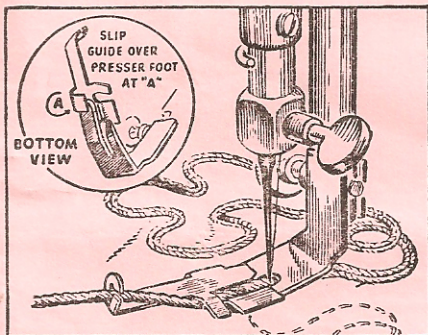


MONOGRAM EMBROIDERY GUIDE

Fits All Standard Sewing Machines

DIRECTIONS—1. Machine should be threaded for ordinary sewing— Raise presser foot, place thread or braid under needle, lower foot, pull thread or braid up between the two toes of foot, then slip the guide on the foot. Slip hook "A" on bottom of Guide over left prong of presser foot (as in illustration). Line up Groove in Guide Plate with needle.) Bring thread over plate, under finger, then through notch of thread holder (as in cut). Keep threads on the left and do not hold when sewing. Sew around pattern—WATCH LINE—as it goes under HUMP IN GUIDE FINGER.



EMBROIDERY

Teatowels, pillowcases, linens, blouses. No. 3 pearl cotton for best results. 2 strands of No. 5 pearl cotton or 12 strand embroidery thread can be used when twisted together.

MONOGRAMING OR FILLED DESIGNS

On dark material and towels, baste design or initial on and sew over paper. Tear off. Outline all designs, then fill in, working from outline toward center. For bath towels, use No. 3 pearl cotton, yarns and all purpose rayon yarn.

APPLIQUE

Baste design around edges, then pin or baste design on materials. Sew around edge, applying No. 3 pearl cotton with guide.

BABY RICK-RACK, SOUTACHE BRAID

Place under foot, same as instructions in No. 1. To make 2 or 3 thread trimming—twist 2 threads of No. 3 Pearl Cotton or 3 thread of No. 5 Pearl Cotton. Sew same as braid.

GENERAL INFORMATION

To finish work, leave one inch loose end, at beginning and end of pattern. Pull loose ends, with sewing threads to under side of work and tie off and cut. Large eye needle can be used for this purpose.

IMPORTANT—If materials are thick, loosen foot bar screw on top of machine, so there is less tension on presser foot. This enables the cloth to turn easy also for braiding. If materials are very thin, place paper under pattern, gives it stiffness while sewing, then tear off.

When using heavy yarns and braids, if materials tend to draw, check to be sure braid and thread is not binding. Let it pass through hole in Guide freely. Top thread tension should not be too tight.

If Guide at first does not fit the presser foot of your machine, adjust the small hook "A" as in illustration. Hook can be opened for a thicker foot, closed for a thinner foot. This can be done with a pair of pliers.
