















TRICKY!

Ck never appears at the beginning of words. If the 'k' sound is at the end of a word and follows a short vowel, it is usually spelled as ck. If it follows a long vowel or consonant, it is spelled as **k**.



Often, \mathbf{n} and \mathbf{k} come together to make **-nk**

EXAMPLE

TRICKY!

Like ck, you will often find **nk** at the end of words and never at the beginning of words.

But **ck** makes a single 'k' sound, whereas in **nk** you can still hear the 'n' before the 'k'.
