

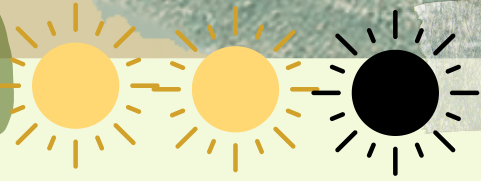
Alocasia

LIGHTING

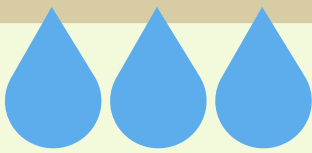


Alocasia Black Velvet is naturally found in shaded areas -- it'll burn with too much light!

WATERING



Alocasias prefer to be kept moist, but not waterlogged -- water when the top of the soil is dry! (They CAN dry out a bit, though!)



HUMIDITY

Humidity is super important to all Alocasia! Average household humidity won't keep it happy for long.



FUN FACTS

Surprisingly little is known about Alocasia Black Velvet -- but it's a naturally-occurring species, unlike many cultivated plants, which are often hybrids!
