Ever wanted to sign a tree? The Autograph Tree is known for exactly that -- people will use their fingernails to sign their name or initials in the leathery leaves and watch as they continue to grow! The leaves are nearly circular and come out folded in pairs.



Brighter light will encourage quicker growth, but Autograph Trees are happy with mediumbright lighting, and are tolerant of low light.

WATERING

Autograph Trees have fairly standard watering needs -- let the top 1/3-1/2 of the substrate dry out between waterings!





Autograph Trees are pretty adaptable as far as humidity goes -they will appreciate higher humidity, but they're okay with less!



FUN FACTS

In the wild, Autograph Trees act like strangler figs, growing on other trees and slowly strangling them to death as they grow.
