Spathiphyllum 'Domino'

Just like a standard peace lily, the Domino
Peace Lily is a wonderfully bushy plant with
long, thin leaves, with a penchant for the
dramatic. But Dominos have gorgeous flecks of
white across their leaves, giving it a nice flair
that can brighten up a room.





While a standard green peace lily does well in low light scenarios, Dominos need more light because of their variegation. Brighter light will mean more flowers, as well!



WATERING

Peace lilies have a reputation for being dramatic plants, and the Domino is no different -- if it's thirsty, it will look like it's died overnight! Give it a drink and it'll perk back up. Keep the soil moist!





HUMIDITY

Like most tropical houseplants, the Domino peace lily prefers higher humidity than the average household will have for it, if at all possible. Higher humidity will mean you'll need to water less often, too!

FUN FACTS

Despite their common name, peace lilies are not true lilies - or even closely related! They're mildly toxic for pets, but won't kill cats like a true
