

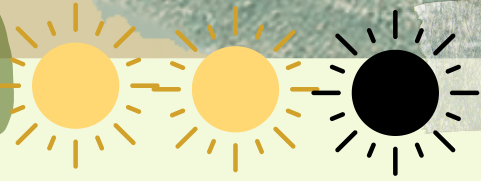
Mini Monstera

Rhaphidophora tetrasperma

Rhaphidophora tetrasperma -- also known by both "Mini Monstera" and "Monstera Ginny" -- are not actually a type of *Monstera*, despite the common names. Still, though, the leaves are strikingly similar to the fenestrations in *Monstera deliciosa*!

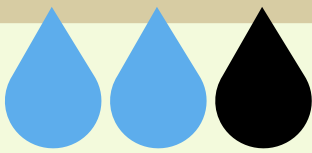
LIGHTING



Brighter growth will encourage quicker growth and larger leaves, but the Mini Monstera is pretty happy with medium-bright situations.



WATERING



Mini Monsteras don't need too much water -- let the top 1/2 of the substrate dry out before watering it again!



HUMIDITY

Mini Monsteras are pretty adaptable as far as humidity goes -- they will appreciate higher humidity, but they're okay with less!



FUN FACTS

Mini Monsteras don't stay mini very long -- they can grow to huge, 6' vines in a single year, even indoors!
