Syngonium podophyllum

Also called Arrowhead Plants and (incorrectly) sometimes Nephthytis, Syngoniums are a wonderful and interesting plant, with large, arrow-shaped, and bushy leaves as juvenile plants, but long vines with different leaf shapes as mature plants! Some people, when their plant starts to vine, will take cuttings to preserve the arrow-shaped leaves instead.

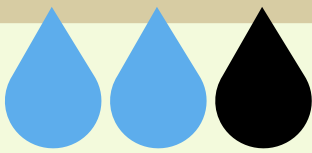
LIGHTING



Syngoniums are remarkably flexible with their lighting -- you can keep them in pretty much any situation, and they'll be content!



WATERING



Thirstier than most aroids -- and most houseplants in general! Let the top $\frac{1}{4}$ at most dry out before watering again.



HUMIDITY

Syngoniums love high humidity, but they're perfectly okay with average household humidity as well!
