There is so much to be remembered about Morecambe & Wise, so many sketches that come to mind and Christmas has never been the same without them, many of us remember planning our evenings around the entertainment. Over the years they moved between channels, but it never seemed to take the sparkle out of the shows.

Born in the mid twenties they first met as 13 year olds at an audition and their double act was formed a few years later. Their early shows were made by ATV - Two of a Kind - until they made their first switch to the BBC. The rest is just history, with each of us having our own favourite moments, that no matter how many times they are replayed don't lose their edge. Who can forget the amply proportioned Janet Webb appearing at the end of each show, thanking viewers for watching her show, or the many famous names who appeared in "plays what I wrote".

Another superb addition to the range - VW014 with a production run of 2,000 pieces is going sell like hot cakes.



Special certificate that will be issued with each model. Each will have a vehicle number, one collector will get the model with the number 2,500,000.

Last year we celebrated the 10th anniversary of Oxford Diecast and many of you treasured the special release of the Bullnose. Indeed we closed the edition at 3,438 pieces after which we had many requests for vehicles which we obviously couldn't supply. This year we are issuing the 2,500,000th Bullnose which will be released sometime in July subject to the timing of production. Like the 10th anniversary model this will come in a presentation box with your name on each certificate. The edition size will be determined when

all orders are received by the end of April latest. (Strictly no orders will be taken after this date). Each certificate will also contain a vehicle number from 2,500,000 onwards. The member who receives this will be chosen at random by computer. The vehicle is painted gold and will be despatched in July under separate cover. You must fill in the special certificate sheet to ensure your correct details are added. The vehicle will cost £9.95 plus £1.45 post and packaging.

2,500,000 pieces is a milestone for one vehicle, and like the 10th anniversary model is one to be kept safe. We have some collections of models in special packs on the horizon which look quite nice and I'm sure will generate plenty of interest. The release of football vehicles continues, we may have a little break in a few Globes, but there are several extra clubs who have signed up which will push the range of vehicles up towards fifteen to twenty variations.

It's about time we saw the Glosters released, one I've look forward to for ages. The earlier releases of this range are already low, or out of stock and some of our new collectors are snapping up the few we have remaining.

A letter received from Mr Bolton prompted us to release this model as he met his wife on the bus many years ago (and celebrates his 50th anniversary this year). Running on the North Circular, this bus was used by many and was a regular on the route. Some of you may think that the advertising categorises it as one of our drink range. The Canada Dry story began when John J. McLaughlin opened a small plant in Toronto, Canada in 1890. He sold the water to drug stores as a simple mixer for fruit juices and flavoured extracts. Today the company is a subsidiary of Cadbury Schweppes.

We've decided that as it carries the London Transport logo it is better placed in the range of RT's.



Sussex boroughs of Hastings, Rye, Chichester and Arundel established forces back in 1835. Brighton & Hove was established even earlier. During the war years the amalgamation of all the forces in the area took place, this being reversed in 1947. However in 1968 the Sussex Constabulary was formed changing later to Sussex Police.

In 1933 Brighton became the first police force in the world to have personal radios. A transmitter was erected on the Town Hall and 30 receivers distributed to patrols. P003 is a nice edition to the range of emergency vehicles.

We've had so many requests to release this model that I'm surprised it's taken Taff so long. It was at the time of the release of the Korean War model last year that we found many members had links to this regiment.

Chinese bugles sounded as another assault on the British Line began. The ammunition was running out and each man had only five rounds left. Suddenly a new sound could be heard, that of Drum Major Philip Buss playing the Last Post. He followed with every call in his repertoire, with one exception 'Retreat',

and the Chinese fell silent. The Glosters held the main invasion route around Imjin River and had been asked to hold the line with 800 men against 27,000 Chinese. Commanded by Lt Col James

Carne the task was of David and Gollath proportions.

Other infantry battalions including (Belgians, Filipinos and Puerto Ricans tried to rescue the Glosters but were driven back. They held the line for four heroic days, and 58 Glosters were

killed with 522 taken prisoner. For his outstanding part in the action Colonel Carne was awarded the Victoria Cross. There are many books about the Glosters and it's worth picking one up as the stories that are told bring tears to your eyes.

We've had many calls over the last few weeks concerning the prices at auction of some of our earlier models.

Obviously we cannot control these and we know its frustrating for some members (many new) to get hold of the past models particularly at these high prices. We can't give valuations ourselves as it is market dependent, the prices at auction depend entirely on the willing buyers present. We see regularly the early models fetching hundreds of pounds. Last month we had to restrict members to one of each of the Glenmorangie and Aldergrove vehicles as we received so many orders for multiple quantities. We even had one order for 25 of each. All we can try and do is to act as fairly as possible ensuring everyone has an equal chance. The best advice is to keep an eye on the releases and ensure you don't miss out on any specials.
