Roy played for 'Melchester Rovers' anybody know the place?



The 7th Gurkha Rifles

The Nepalese fighters trained by the British Army. Held affectionately in the hearts of all World War veterans - those fighting men from Nepal.

Who can forget the reception received by these superb warriors at the Queens Coronation in 1953. Next to the Queen of Tonga and the Queen herself, the loudest cheers were for the marching Gurkhas.

The Cap badge of the 7th shows 2 Kukris pointed upwards, the handles crossed in saltire.

In World War I the regiment fought in the Middle East at Magiodo, Sharon and Palestine.

In World War II they fought in Italy winning more laurels for their courage at Monte Cassino.

Following the bombings of the Abbey at Monte Cassino, the enemy moved troops into the ruins to make it an impregnable fortress. The Gurkha's tried in vain - they charged up the slopes with weapons bared, but were caught in a merciless crossfire that forced them to turn back.

The 7th Gurkha Riffles went on to fight in Burma against the Japanese.

One side of the vehicle features an advertisement for 'Brylcream' which was launched in 1950 and featured the England batsman Dennis Compton.

The other side carries the news 'Petrol Rationing Ends'. This saw a motoring boom as rationing ended after 10 years of coupon books and petrol was for sale at around 2/- a gallon!

The Mayor of Buxton was at a derationing celebration where balloons and rockets were let off. He said "The end of rationing will be a boon to holiday resorts up and down the land"! At garages Ration Books were torn up as people danced around cars.

After Dinner Smokers Companion Set

Imagine dinner is over and the fire's smouldering in the hearth - the tummies are full and the ladies are gassing!

The men retire into the smoking lounge confronted by a log fire to play cribbage perhaps or just to enjoy a chat!

"A nice cigar my friend - or a wee pinch of snuff, plus a nice dram of the hard stuff eh!" Doesn't it conjure up memories of days long gone, but this 'Smokers Companion Set' stirs up the nostalgia with it's wonderful back in time brands – so much so if you close your eyes you can almost smell the log fire and the aroma from the tumbler of whisky – with a tinge of smoke drifting across the room from a well loved briar pipe or nice cigar.


The Smokers Companion Set would make an ideal Christmas gift and consists of:-

Englands Glory Matches (Bullnose)

First designed and manufactured by Samuel John Morland as lucifers in 1867.

Samuel Morland chose the sight of his factory carefully and wisely situating it close to the canal, which brought him his wood and materials very cheaply and quickly whilst taking away the finished product as well.

To meet British Standards, the matches had to undergo stringent testing whereby 1000 matches were struck every hour to determine many things -whether they would break - how many would be ignited on the one single strike strip on a box - to comply it had to reach twice the amount packed.



Manufactured by John Freeman in 1839, initially in London and then in Cardiff, South Wales.

Around the turn of the century, cigar smoking had become popular in Gt. Britain, in particular the smaller cheaper cigars which were starting to be made by machine.

In 1912, J.R. Freeman & Son launched 'Manikin Cigars' a small cigar with a mild Havana flavour and packed in a slide carton.

The brand name was inspired by Bill Freeman (son or brother of John) after seeing a Music Hall act 'The 3 Manikins'.

Kendal Brown Snuff (Model T)

A pinch of snuff onto the back of the hand then a sharp quick sniff up the nostrils.

Kendal brown mild mixture - the gentleman's brand at 10d per oz or 12/11d per Ib.

For those of you who have never tried it don't bother!

Glenord Whisky (Chevrolet)

A fine 12 year old malt whisky from a distillery in Ross-shire. The whisky has a pleasing caramel flavour and smooth finish. The distillery stands on the tributary of the River Conan (the Oranburn) whose clear waters have been used by both legal and illegal whisky manufacturers alike.

The Ross-shire distillery was founded in 1838 on land leased from the Mackenzies of Ord to provide a ready market for Barley produced off Mackenzie farms.

Taffs Column

I have had one or two conversations with members recently regarding the Chevrolet Truck. Our model is actually based on a British built Chevrolet, which was introduced in February 1929. The 30-cwt chassis was made available at a price of £190.00 and became popular very quickly. Initially, assembly took place at Hendon using imported components from Canada to avoid the import duties for USA built items. Soon after introduction, the production of the vehicles was transferred to Luton at which point the majority of the components became British built. The factory premises were built within the Vauxhall Motors factory site. The model was the forerunner of the Bedford series of trucks, which were introduced in 1931.

I recently visited the Plymouth die-Cast Collectors Club and it was great to meet many of their members. We had an interesting evening talking about Die-Cast collecting. We will probably bring out a Plymouth theme model next year as a result of ideas submitted after the presentation.
