

There was something very reassuring about Dixon of Dock Green, particularly as his idea of punishing a juvenile delinquent was with a clip round the ear. I recall the programme fondly as I would be at my grandfather's house and he would ensure that I sat down and

watched the full 45 minutes, I think it was his way of disciplining me!



George Dixon was the policeman we loved and respected, although it wasn't the original intention for him to appear in his own series. He first appeared in a rank movie The Blue Lamp where he was gunned down by armed robber Dirk Bogarde. He was resurrected by his creator Ted Willis to star in the new series which replaced Fabian of the Yard. Based at London's fictitious Dock Green he continued his beat for the next 21 years and each programme began with a monolgue to camera beneath the police stations blue lamp - the message being crime doesn't pay. He was later promoted to Desk Sergeant and other characters appeared takiing up much of the story line. After 429 episodes Dixon of Dock Green came to an end in 1976, Jack Warner who played George was at this time 80 years of age -he died 5 years later.










The new season is under way and maybe your favourite team is going to win the league. Just make sure that you're not missing out on some of our past releases. The models in

F004 BRIGHTON







Adolf Hitler has escaped death at the hands of his own officers. The aim of the plot NEW RELEASE was to eliminate Hitler, freeing the army of its



military oath, then seize control of command centres, disarm the SS and arrest the Nazi leadership.

The assassination was to have taken place in October this year, but the Normandy landings in June made it necessary to bring the plan forward, which may have contributed to its failure. The main conspirators were senior officers on the General Staff, controlling the War Ministry. The ADC to a General leading the plot was Colonel von Stauffenberg, who on 19th July took a

> small time bomb in a diplomatic case to a conference which Hitler would attend. This was expected to be in a concrete bunker, which would concentrate the blast. Unfortunately it took place in a wooden hut, which collapsed at the blast, dissipating its effect, and Hitler had just moved away from the bomb as it

exploded.

Hitler was injured, but von Stauffenburg, seeing the explosion, assumed he had been killed and gave the

word for the plan to proceed. Fierce fighting began between army and SS, and anti-Nazi activists came out into the open. Then it was revealed that Hitler was alive, and the revolt collapsed. This meant that anti-Hitler elements had shown their hands, and the Nazis were able to execute many of their enemies.






















H003 Set of six vehicles featuring Fullers Brewery.
