## HOW MANY BEADS IS THAT?

One of the most common questions about strung beads we answer every day is "How many beads is that?" Here is an easy way to figure that out!

Beads are usually measured in millimeter sizes (abbreviated as mm), and strings are usually measured in length by inches (abbreviated as in.). Often beads are sold by the string, or by the dozen strings. How to do the math?

Follow these 3 Easy Steps:

## 1) Start with the number 25 . This number never changes!

2) Multiply $25 x$ the length of strings in inches.

## 3) Divide that number by the size of the bead.*

That number is the approximate number of beads per string.
if you have a dozen strings, multiply by 12 for the count per dozen strings.

* If it is a round bead, divide by the mm size of the bead; if it is an oval, pearshape or tube, divide by the longer mm size; and If it is a rondel, divide by the smaller mm size.
