

Lulu Pet Bed

Designed by Team Love Fest

A sturdy and super cozy bed for your four-legged friend. Just pick your pet's favorite color and get started!

Sizing: It's easy to adjust this pattern to the ideal size for your pet. One 50-yard ball of Tough Love yarn will create a bed that's approximately 16" in diameter with an edge that's 2.5" in height. This pattern uses two 50-yard balls of Tough Love to create a roughly 22" bed with a 2.5" edge. When crocheting this bed using the spiral method detailed below, each round will increase by 6 stitches until you reach your ultimate size. You can continue adding six stitches to each round until you find your desired diameter then create an edge by keeping with a single crochet for 2 or more rounds (or until you run out of yarn).

Finished Measurements: Approximately 22" diameter, 2.5" edge

Materials and Notions:

- 2 x 50-yard balls of Tough Love yarn (pictured here in Graphite)
- Size U (25mm crochet hook) or just your fingers
- Stitch marker (optional but very helpful)

Abbreviations:

SC - Single Crochet

- Round 1: Using a magic loop (aka magic circle) cast on, SC six stitches. Place marker on the first stitch you cast on to keep track of the beginning of each round. Grab the tail and pull tight to close inner circle. (6 stitches total)
- Round 2: 2 SC in each stitch (12 stitches total) placing your stitch marker on your first stitch in this round (repeat this step to mark the first stitch of each round to help you keep count)
- Round 3: Alternate between 1 SC and 2 SC until the end of the round (18 stitches total)
- Round 4: 1 SC in next 2 stitches, 2 SC in the following stitch, repeat until the end of the round (24 stitches total)
- Round 5: 2 SC, 1 SC in next 3 stitches, repeat until the end of the round (30 stitches total)
- Round 6: 2 SC, 1 SC in next 4 stitches, repeat until the end of the round (36 stitches total)
- Round 7: 2 SC, 1 SC in next 5 stitches, repeat until the end of the round (42 stitches total)
- Round 8+: 1 SC in each stitch to create vertical edge, continue until you come to the end of your yarn. Weave in cast off and cast on ends. (The cast off tail can be used to create a continuous edge, just insert the tail under the next cast off stitch then insert your yarn back into the center of the last stitch you cast off). All done!
