




▲ "MULGRA" Acrylic on Arches paper 750 x 570 1993





■ "MAD FURRY LOVE" Acrylic on canvas 520 x 620 1993


▲ "DOGS AND COWS"Acrylic and collage on canvas 1200 x 900 1993

▲ "TIME LORD" Acrylic, oil and wire mesh on canvas 520 x 620 1993


Unsung beginning endless time
