






Angel's Heart

'Angel's Heart' takes us on a pictorial journey into a type of "archetypical" stage play. It explores how as a Western world we may find clues in our own imagination to overcome the spiritual desertion that inevitably comes with the current "cultural dissolving" in our society and the sense of displacement and loneliness we feel as "smarty modern man", with an answer for everything except our souls' dark night.

I look into Western ideological beginnings in the Garden of Eden wherein the emotional and psychological foundations of human society lie.

The undeniable result of an inability to evaluate our personal and worldly history as a journey of learning for the heart, which is natural, is personal misery, fear, insecurity and confusion. Failed or tortured relationships are the result, be they on a world scale or within a family. We are all feeling the burden of this frustration in our modern age.

The theme of denial and then discovery is the basis for most of my paintings.

Stunning myths have been passed down and remained in memory far longer than dull facts. Hence the storytellers for thousands of years used fantastic imagery to tell tales of morals and values to their children when no pen and paper existed. Myth and imagination are key tools in assisting us all to get through difficult emotional passages, even in modern life. The use of the great stories and myths have stayed alive but are scattered, not understandable to the average person, vague in their point and dull in application to our modern age due to "cultural death". We can't go back, so we have to rebuild a new bridge to spiritual and emotional health without the security

that physical and formal religious boundaries may have once given us.

At this point it can be helpful to transform ourselves in our imagination into a metaphor or archetype in order to more easily explore our ideal potential and to see the way forward.

In this collection, the snake rampages or glides through the works as a constant. The only thing not constant is his mood or intention to the viewer. For it is within the viewer's own experience of the world and how it has affected him/her that gives away the mood of the snake. The snake is destructive and evil if we ignore the fact that he is also the essence of life and love. We need to understand he is passion, excitement and a pivot for learning and growth.

The point is that these elements are within us all, the primal serpent; the snake, the angel, the clown, the eagle and the butcher, in varying proportions of priority and predominance. To view and teach the history of humankind as a volume of documented chronicles, as opposed to a journey of discovery in one's psychological development and more so, the secret to our future harmony, would be one of the greatest failings of humankind. We can't live in the past and grieve what is gone, or destroy our hopes for the future with the fear of the past. Once a birth begins it must end, thus becoming "a life". If we are born into today, we have a chance to start a life no matter what the handicap we still hold from the past.

There is hope, just get on with it.










The 30 Day War Oil on Belgium Linen 150 x 180 cm
