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GENESIS

WEEK 1: *God creates the heavens and the earth* • **Genesis 1:1–2:3**

Principle: Everything God made was good.

Ask Your Child: What did God say about everything He had made?

Apply: By thanking God for making the heavens and the earth.

This Week: As a family, read Genesis 1:1–2:3.

Next Week: Genesis 1:26–29; 2:7, 18–24

WEEK 2: *God creates man and woman* • **Genesis 1:26–31; 2:7–24**

Principle: God created man to worship Him.

Ask Your Child: Why did God make man?

Apply: By worshiping God, who made us.

This Week: As a family, read Genesis 1:26–29; 2:7, 18–24.

Next Week: Genesis 2:15–17; 3:1–24

WEEK 3: *Man rebels against God* • **Genesis 2:15–17; 3:1–24**

Principle: God will punish those who do not obey Him.

Ask Your Child: How did Adam and Eve sin against God?

Apply: By trusting God in all things.

This Week: As a family, read Genesis 2:15–17; 3:1–24.

Next Week: Genesis 4:1–15

WEEK 4: *Cain rebels against God* • **Genesis 4:1–15**

Principle: God will punish sinful attitudes and actions.

Ask Your Child: What offerings did Cain and Abel bring to God?

Apply: By serving the Lord with gladness.

This Week: As a family, read Genesis 4:1–15.

Next Week: Genesis 6:5–7:24

WEEK 5: *God floods the earth* • **Genesis 6:5–7:24**

Principle: God judges man for his sinfulness.

Ask Your Child: Why was God going to flood the earth?

Apply: By repenting and trusting Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord.

This Week: As a family, read Genesis 6:5–7:24.

Next Week: Genesis 8:1–9:17

WEEK 6: *God preserves Noah* • **Genesis 8:1–9:17**

Principle: God is loving and keeps His promises.

Ask Your Child: What covenant did God make with mankind?

Apply: By trusting that God will always do what He says.

This Week: As a family, read Genesis 8:1–9:17.

Next Week: Genesis 11:1–9



WEEK 7: *God judges the nations at Babel* • Genesis 11:1-9

Principle: God will judge those who do not obey His commands.

Ask Your Child: Why did the people build the tower?

Apply: By turning from pride.

This Week: As a family, read Genesis 11:1-9.

Next Week: Genesis 11:27-12:9

WEEK 8: *God makes a promise to Abram* • Genesis 11:27-12:9

Principle: God keeps His promises.

Ask Your Child: What did God promise Abram?

Apply: By believing in God's Word like Abraham.

This Week: As a family, read Genesis 11:27-12:9.

Next Week: Genesis 16:1-6; 17:15-21; 18:1-15

WEEK 9: *Abraham and Sarah doubt God* • Genesis 16:1-6; 17:15-21; 18:1-15

Principle: Nothing can stop God's plans.

Ask Your Child: What did God promise Abraham and Sarah?

Apply: By trusting God's promises, even if they seem impossible.

This Week: As a family, read Genesis 16:1-6; 17:15-21; 18:1-15.

Next Week: Genesis 18:16-19:29

WEEK 10: *God judges Sodom and Gomorrah* • Genesis 18:16-19:29

Principle: God hates and judges sin.

Ask Your Child: Why was God going to punish the people of Sodom and Gomorrah?

Apply: By turning from sin.

This Week: As a family, read Genesis 18:16-19:29.

Next Week: Genesis 21:1-14

WEEK 11: *God sends baby Isaac* • Genesis 21:1-14

Principle: God always keeps His promises.

Ask Your Child: Who was Isaac and why was his birth a miracle?

Apply: By trusting God to keep His promises.

This Week: As a family, read Genesis 21:1-14.

Next Week: Genesis 22:1-19; Hebrews 11:17-19

WEEK 12: *God tests Abraham* • Genesis 22:1-19

Principle: God calls Christians to trust Him completely and above all else.

Ask Your Child: How did God test Abraham's faith?

Apply: By obeying God's Word, no matter what the cost.

This Week: As a family, read Genesis 22:1-19; Hebrews 11:17-19.

Next Week: Genesis 25:21-26; 27:1-29



WEEK 13: *God chooses Jacob over Esau* • **Genesis 25:21–34; 27:1–28:5**

Principle: God sovereignly chooses whomever He wants to accomplish His purposes.

Ask Your Child: Which brother did God choose to receive the birthright?

Apply: By patiently waiting for God's timing.

This Week: As a family, read Genesis 25:21–26; 27:1–29.

Next Week: Genesis 32

WEEK 14: *Jacob wrestles with God* • **Genesis 32:1–33:20**

Principle: God hears the prayers of those who believe in Him.

Ask Your Child: Why did Jacob pray?

Apply: By trusting God instead of fearing men.

This Week: As a family, read Genesis 32.

Next Week: Genesis 37

WEEK 15: *God preserves Joseph* • **Genesis 37:1–36**

Principle: God cares for His people.

Ask Your Child: How did God preserve Joseph?

Apply: By trusting and honoring God even when he has problems with others.

This Week: As a family, read Genesis 37.

Next Week: Genesis 39–50

WEEK 16: *God delivers Joseph* • **Genesis 39:1–50:26**

Principle: God is in control of every circumstance.

Ask Your Child: How did God help Joseph while he was in Egypt?

Apply: By being faithful and obedient to God during difficult times.

This Week: As a family, read Genesis 39–50.

Next Week: Exodus 1–2



EXODUS

WEEK 17: *God prepares Israel for deliverance* • Exodus 1:1–2:25

Principle: God has compassion for His people.

Ask Your Child: Why did Pharaoh decide to kill all of the Israelites' baby boys?

Apply: By crying out to God for help in times of trouble.

This Week: As a family, read Exodus 1–2.

Next Week: Exodus 3

WEEK 18: *God raises Moses to leads Israel* • Exodus 3:1–4:31

Principle: God's plans cannot be stopped.

Ask Your Child: What did God call Moses to do?

Apply: By trusting God because His plans are perfect.

This Week: As a family, read Exodus 3.

Next Week: Exodus 7–10

WEEK 19: *God sends plagues on Egypt* • Exodus 7:1–10:29

Principle: God is awesome and powerful.

Ask Your Child: Why did God send the plagues?

Apply: By telling other people about God's greatness.

This Week: As a family, read portions of Exodus 7–10.

Next Week: Exodus 12–13

WEEK 20: *God ordains the Passover* • Exodus 14:1–13:22

Principle: God is merciful and sovereign.

Ask Your Child: What was God's final judgment on Egypt?

Apply: By trusting Christ as the final Passover lamb.

This Week: As a family, read Exodus 12–13.

Next Week: Exodus 14–15

WEEK 21: *God parts the Red Sea* • Exodus 14:1–15:21

Principle: God wants us to trust and praise Him for His power.

Ask Your Child: How did the Israelites escape the Egyptian army?

Apply: By praising God for His mighty deeds.

This Week: As a family, read Exodus 14–15.

Next Week: Exodus 15:22–17:7

WEEK 22: *God preserves Israel* • Exodus 15:22–17:7

Principle: God is merciful and good.

Ask Your Child: Why did the Israelites grumble and complain?

Apply: By trusting that God's Word is good.

This Week: As a family, read Exodus 15:22–17:7.

Next Week: Exodus 19



WEEK 23: *God prepares Israel for the covenant* • Exodus 19:1–25

Principle: God is worthy of fear and reverence.

Ask Your Child: What did God promise Israel?

Apply: By obeying God's Word wholeheartedly.

This Week: As a family, read Exodus 19.

Next Week: Exodus 20:1–21

WEEK 24: *God gives the Ten Commandments* • Exodus 20:1–21

Principle: God's standards are perfect.

Ask Your Child: Why did God give laws to the Israelites?

Apply: By loving God more than anything else.

This Week: As a family, read Exodus 20:1–21.

Next Week: Exodus 25–31

WEEK 25: *God ordains the tabernacle* • Exodus 25:1–27:19; 30:1–10

Principle: God has made a way for us to dwell with Him.

Ask Your Child: What does the tabernacle tell us about God?

Apply: By worshiping God in an honoring way.

This Week: As a family, read Exodus 25–31.

Next Week: Exodus 32

WEEK 26: *God punishes Israel's idolatry* • Exodus 32:1–35

Principle: God is merciful and patient.

Ask Your Child: How did God show mercy to the Israelites?

Apply: By thanking God for His specific acts of mercy.

This Week: As a family, read Exodus 32.

Next Week: Exodus 33–34, 40

WEEK 27: *God's presence fills the tabernacle* • Exodus 33:1–34:35; 40:1–38

Principle: God is merciful and faithful.

Ask Your Child: How did God presence fill the Tabernacle?

Apply: By joyfully praising God for sending His Son and Holy Spirit.

This Week: As a family, read Exodus 33–34 and 40.

Next Week: Leviticus 1–7



LEVITICUS

WEEK 28: *God ordains the sacrificial system* • **Leviticus 1:1–7:38**

Principle: God's holiness requires a sacrifice for sin.

Ask Your Child: What types of offerings did the Israelites give to God?

Apply: By trusting Jesus to take his or her punishment.

This Week: As a family, read Leviticus 1–7.

Next Week: Leviticus 9:22–10:7

WEEK 29: *God establishes the priesthood* • **Leviticus 8:1–10:7**

Principle: Man needs a mediator to come before God.

Ask Your Child: What happened to the two priests who disobeyed God's commands?

Apply: By worshiping God with the right attitudes and actions.

This Week: As a family, read Leviticus 9:22–10:7.

Next Week: Leviticus 11–16

WEEK 30: *God ordains the Day of Atonement* • **Leviticus 16:1–34**

Principle: Man constantly needs to confess sin.

Ask Your Child: What was the purpose of the Day of Atonement?

Apply: By trusting Jesus for eternal forgiveness.

This Week: As a family, read Leviticus 11–16.

Next Week: Leviticus 19

WEEK 31: *God requires holy living* • **Leviticus 19:1–37**

Principle: God is holy and wants believers to live holy lives.

Ask Your Child: What does it mean to be holy?

Apply: By obeying his or her father and mother.

This Week: As a family, read Leviticus 19.

Next Week: Numbers 11–12



NUMBERS

WEEK 32: *Israel rejects God's provisions* • **Numbers 11:1–12:16**

Principle: God is displeased when we complain.

Ask Your Child: Why did the Israelites complain about God's provision?

Apply: By thanking God for the blessings in our lives.

This Week: As a family, read Numbers 11–12.

Next Week: Numbers 13–14

WEEK 33: *Israel rejects God's plan* • **Numbers 13:1–14:45**

Principle: God's plans always are best.

Ask Your Child: What kind of report did the spies bring back?

Apply: By trusting that God's plan is best.

This Week: As a family, read Numbers 13–14.

Next Week: Numbers 16

WEEK 34: *Israel rejects God's prophet and priest* • **Numbers 16:1–17:11**

Principle: We should obey and respect the leadership that God has established.

Ask Your Child: Why did the people complain?

Apply: By valuing the leadership God has put in his life.

This Week: As a family, read Numbers 16.

Next Week: Numbers 21

WEEK 35: *God offers Israel healing from sin* • **Numbers 20:2–13; 21:4–9**

Principle: God is merciful and faithful.

Ask Your Child: How did God offer healing from the snakebites?

Apply: By trusting Jesus as Savior.

This Week: As a family, read Numbers 21:4–9.

Next Week: Numbers 22–24

WEEK 36: *God blesses Israel through Balaam* • **Numbers 22:1–24:25**

Principle: God is sovereign and keeps His promises.

Ask Your Child: What did God allow Balaam to do to Israel?

Apply: By remembering that God's blessing is unchangeable.

This Week: As a family, read Numbers 22–24.



CHRISTMAS

WEEK 1: *God promises to send the Messiah, Part 1* • **Genesis 3:15; 12:1–3; 49:10**

Principle: God fulfills His promises.

Ask Your Child: What promises about Jesus are in Genesis?

Apply: By worshiping Jesus, the Deliverer, Savior, and King.

This Week: As a family, read Genesis 3:15; 12:1–3; 49:10

Next Week: Isaiah 7:14; Matthew 1:18–25, 2:1–12; Micah 5:2

WEEK 2: *God promises to send the Messiah, Part 2* • **Isaiah 7:14; Micah 5:2**

Principle: Jesus is the Messiah.

Ask Your Child: Who were the prophets?

Apply: By humbly obeying Christ, the King.

This Week: As a family, read Isaiah 7:14; Micah 5:2; Matthew 1:18–25, 2:1–12

Next Week: Luke 1:5–25, 57–67, 76–79

WEEK 3: *God sends John the Baptist* • **Luke 1:5–25, 57–67, 76–79**

Principle: Jesus is Savior and Lord.

Ask Your Child: What is important about the names Immanuel, Savior, and Son of the Most High?

Apply: By obeying Jesus Christ as Lord and God.

This Week: As a family, read Luke 1:5–25, 57–67, 76–79

Next Week: Matthew 1:18–25; Luke 1:26–38

WEEK 4: *God announces the Messiah's birth* • **Matthew 1:18–25; Luke 1:26–38**

Principle: Jesus is Savior and Lord and deserves all our worship.

Ask Your Child: What is important about the names Immanuel, Savior, and Son of the Most High?

Apply: By obeying Jesus Christ as Lord and God.

This Week: As a family, read Matthew 1:18–25; Luke 1:26–38

Next Week: Matthew 2:1–18

WEEK 5: *The Wise Men worship Jesus* • **Matthew 2:1–18**

Principle: Jesus deserves our worship because He is the King of kings.

Ask Your Child: What did the wise men do when they found Jesus?

Apply: By worshiping Jesus in song and deed.

This Week: As a family, read Matthew 2:1–18



EASTER

WEEK 1: *Jesus enters Jerusalem as King* • **Matthew 21:1–23:39**

Principle: Jesus is the promised Messiah.

Ask Your Child: How did the crowds treat Jesus as the promised King?

Apply: By obeying Jesus as King.

This Week: As a family, read Matthew 21:1–23:39.

Next Week: Matthew 26:1–16, 47–56; 27:3–10

WEEK 2: *Judas betrays Jesus* • **Matthew 26:1–16, 47–56; 27:3–10**

Principle: People deny or betray Jesus with sinful attitudes and actions.

Ask Your Child: How did Judas betray Jesus?

Apply: By thanking Jesus for being faithful even when people reject Him.

This Week: As a family, read Matthew 26:1–16, 47–56; 27:3–10.

Next Week: Matthew 26:57–27:2, 11–66

WEEK 3: *Jesus endures the cross* • **Matthew 26:57–27:2, 11–66**

Principle: Jesus died for sin, giving access to God.

Ask Your Child: Why did Jesus die?

Apply: By thanking Jesus for providing the only way of salvation.

This Week: As a family, read Matthew 26:57–27:2, 11–66.

Next Week: Matthew 28:1–20

WEEK 4: *Jesus rises from the dead* • **Matthew 28:1–20**

Principle: Jesus has power over sin and death.

Ask Your Child: What did Jesus tell His disciples?

Apply: By obeying Jesus as Savior and Lord.

This Week: As a family, read Matthew 28:1–20.
