THE LIFE OF CHRIST

WEEK 1: *John prepares the way for the Lord* • **Matthew 3:1–12**

Principle: True repentance produces spiritual fruit in every believer.

Ask Your Child: Why did John not allow the Pharisees and Sadducees to be baptized?

Apply: By examining his or her life for spiritual fruit.

This Week: As a family, read Matthew 3:1–12.

Next Week: Matthew 3:13–17

WEEK 2: *John baptizes Jesus* • **Matthew 3:13–17**

Principle: Jesus was sent by the Father to provide salvation to those who would believe.

Ask Your Child: What happened after Jesus came out of the water?

Apply: By learning what it means to please God the Father.

This Week: As a family, read Matthew 3:13–17.

Next Week: Luke 4:1–13

WEEK 3: *Jesus overcomes temptation* • **Luke 4:1–13**

Principle: Only Jesus is righteous enough to take away the punishment for your sin.

Ask Your Child: How did Jesus respond to Satan's temptation in words and actions?

Apply: By trusting God's Word when he or she is tempted to sin.

This Week: As a family, read Luke 4:1–13.

Next Week: Mark 1:16–20

WEEK 4: *Jesus calls the disciples* • **Mark 1:16–20**

Principle: Jesus' authority demonstrates that He is God's Messiah.

Ask Your Child: What was Jesus' message?

Apply: By obeying the Lord Jesus who taught, preached, and healed with authority.

This Week: As a family, read Mark 1:16–20.

Next Week: Matthew 8:5–13

WEEK 5: *Jesus commends the Centurion's faith* • **Matthew 8:5–13**

Principle: Jesus provides salvation to all who believe in Him.

Ask Your Child: How did the centurion respond to Jesus?

Apply: By asking God for faith to believe.

This Week: As a family, read Matthew 8:5–13.

Next Week: Luke 5:17–26

WEEK 6: *Jesus forgives sin* • **Luke 5:17–26**

Principle: Forgiveness of sin comes only through Jesus.

Ask Your Child: How did Jesus' power to heal prove His authority to forgive?

Apply: By thanking God for not remembering sins that He has forgiven.

This Week: As a family, read Luke 5:17–26.

Next Week: Matthew 11:20–30



WEEK 7: *Jesus promises rest* • Matthew 11:20–30

Principle: Jesus says to take up His yoke, and learn from Him.

Ask Your Child: Why is it dangerous to hear about Jesus' miracles and not repent?

Apply: By taking up Jesus' yoke and learning from Him.

This Week: As a family, read Matthew 11:20–30.

Next Week: Matthew 12:22–37

WEEK 8: *Jesus rebukes the Pharisees* • Matthew 12:22–37

Principle: The Holy Spirit reveals Jesus Christ.

Ask Your Child: What does it mean to blaspheme the Holy Spirit?

Apply: By responding to the Holy Spirit's revelation about Jesus Christ.

This Week: As a family, read Matthew 12:22–37.

Next Week: Mark 4:1–20

WEEK 9: *Jesus teaches the Parable of the Soil* • Mark 4:1–20

Principle: People respond differently to the sowing of God's Word.

Ask Your Child: What are the different soils and what do they represent?

Apply: By examining his or her response to God's Word.

This Week: As a family, read Mark 4:1–20.

Next Week: Luke 8:22–39

WEEK 10: *Jesus demonstrates His authority* • Luke 8:22–39

Principle: Jesus has power over the natural and the supernatural world.

Ask Your Child: What do these two miracles tell us about Jesus Christ?

Apply: By worshiping Jesus by obeying Him.

This Week: As a family, read Luke 8:22–39.

Next Week: Mark 5:21–43

WEEK 11: *Jesus has power over disease and death* • Mark 5:21–43

Principle: Jesus has power over death and disease.

Ask Your Child: How did the woman and Jairus demonstrate their faith?

Apply: By repenting and believing on Jesus for salvation.

This Week: As a family, read Mark 5:21–43.

Next Week: John 6:1–15

WEEK 12: *Jesus feeds the 5,000* • John 6:1–15

Principle: The feeding of the multitude demonstrated Jesus' deity.

Ask Your Child: Why did Jesus ask the disciples to give the people food?

Apply: By having compassion on those who need Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord.

This Week: As a family, read John 6:1–15.

Next Week: Matthew 14:23–33



WEEK 13: *Jesus walks on water* • **Matthew 14:23–33**

Principle: Jesus is God and has authority over nature.

Ask Your Child: Why did the disciples worship Jesus?

Apply: By demonstrating his or her trust in Jesus by serving and obeying Him.

This Week: As a family, read Matthew 14:23–33.

Next Week: Mark 8:27–38

WEEK 14: *Jesus defines discipleship* • **Mark 8:27–38**

Principle: The cost of following Jesus is denying oneself, and following Him.

Ask Your Child: What does it mean to die to yourself, pick up your cross and follow Christ?

Apply: By denying himself or herself, taking up his or her cross, and following Christ.

This Week: As a family, read Mark 8:27–38.

Next Week: Luke 9:27–36

WEEK 15: *Jesus is gloriously transfigured* • **Luke 9:27–36**

Principle: Jesus' glory is seen during His transfiguration.

Ask Your Child: What did God the Father reveal about His Son?

Apply: By listening to Jesus through God's Word.

This Week: As a family, read Luke 9:27–36.

Next Week: Matthew 19:16–26

WEEK 16: *Jesus confronts the rich young ruler* • **Matthew 19:16–26**

Principle: Believers are called to count the cost of eternal life and follow Christ.

Ask Your Child: Why did the rich, young ruler go away sad?

Apply: By asking Christ to reveal anything in his/her heart that he/she is unwilling to give up for Him.

This Week: As a family, read Matthew 19:16–26.

Next Week: Matthew 19:27–20:16

WEEK 17: *Jesus teaches the parable of the equal wages* • **Matthew 19:27–20:16**

Principle: God demonstrates His sovereign grace to whoever He chooses.

Ask Your Child: What does the parable of the laborers reveal about God?

Apply: By remembering that God is sovereign over whom He saves and rewards.

This Week: As a family, read Matthew 19:27–20:16.

Next Week: Luke 19:28–44

WEEK 18: *Jesus enters Jerusalem* • **Luke 19:28–44**

Principle: Jesus is worthy of praise and obedience.

Ask Your Child: What were the crowds shouting as Jesus entered Jerusalem?

Apply: By obeying Jesus as King in every area of life.

This Week: As a family, read Luke 19:28–44.

Next Week: Mark 12:1–12



WEEK 19: *Jesus teaches the parable of the landowner* • **Mark 12:1–12**

Principle: There is a terrible consequence for rejecting Christ.

Ask Your Child: What did Jesus teach the Pharisees in the parable of the landowner?

Apply: By warning those who reject Christ of the coming judgment.

This Week: As a family, read portions of Mark 12:1–12.

Next Week: Matthew 25:14–30

WEEK 20: *Jesus teaches the parable of the talents* • **Matthew 25:14–30**

Principle: God gave gifts to believers to faithfully further God's kingdom.

Ask Your Child: Why was the master happy with the servants who earned more talents?

Apply: By rejoicing that God rewards faithful people.

This Week: As a family, read Matthew 25:14–30.

Next Week: Matthew 26:1–56

WEEK 21: *Jesus prepares for His death* • **Matthew 26:1–56**

Principle: Jesus is denied or betrayed with sinful attitudes and actions.

Ask Your Child: How was Jesus rejected and betrayed?

Apply: By demonstrating love for Jesus by obeying Him.

This Week: As a family, read Matthew 26:1–56.

Next Week: Mark 14:53–15:15

WEEK 22: *The trial and denial of Jesus* • **Mark 14:53–15:15**

Principle: Everyone is accountable for their response to Jesus Christ.

Ask Your Child: How did people respond to Jesus differently?

Apply: By thanking God for His sovereignty.

This Week: As a family, read Mark 14:53–15:15.

Next Week: Mark 15:16–47

WEEK 23: *Jesus endures the cross* • **Mark 15:16–47**

Principle: Jesus should be worshiped because of His sacrifice for sin and provision for eternal life.

Ask Your Child: Why was the death of Jesus important?

Apply: By praising God for Christ's sacrifice for sin.

This Week: As a family, read Mark 15:16–47.

Next Week: Mark 16:1–8

WEEK 24: *Jesus rises from the dead* • **Mark 16:1–8**

Principle: Believers are to be astonished and amazed because the gospel.

Ask Your Child: Why was the resurrection important?

Apply: By telling others about Christ's death and resurrection.

This Week: As a family, read Mark 16:1–8.

Next Week: Acts 1:1–11



THE ACTS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

WEEK 25: *Jesus returns to heaven* • Acts 1:1–11

Principle: God's plan to spread the gospel will continue until Jesus returns.

Ask Your Child: What was God's plan for the spread of the gospel?

Apply: By proclaiming the gospel to others.

This Week: As a family, read Acts 1:1–11.

Next Week: Acts 2:1–47

WEEK 26: *The Holy Spirit arrives* • Acts 2:1–47

Principle: Those who trust in Christ receive the Holy Spirit.

Ask Your Child: What happened on the day of Pentecost?

Apply: By testifying to Jesus' death, resurrection, and ascension.

This Week: As a family, read Acts 2:1–47.

Next Week: Acts 3:1–26

WEEK 27: *Peter and John preach the gospel* • Acts 3:1–26

Principle: There is no other name under heaven by which people can be saved.

Ask Your Child: How was Jesus' name exalted in today's lesson?

Apply: By proclaiming salvation in Jesus' name with boldness.

This Week: As a family, read Acts 3:1–26.

Next Week: Acts 4:32–5:11

WEEK 28: *Ananias and Sapphira lie to the Holy Spirit* • Acts 4:32–5:11

Principle: Believers should fear being hypocrites.

Ask Your Child: Why did God take the lives of Ananias and Sapphira?

Apply: By fearing God, who has power over life and death.

This Week: As a family, read Acts 4:32–5:11.

Next Week: Acts 6:1–7:60

WEEK 29: *The Jews resist the Holy Spirit* • Acts 6:1–7:60

Principle: Those who trust in Christ receive the Holy Spirit.

Ask Your Child: What were the characteristics of those who were saved?

Apply: By testifying to Jesus' death, resurrection, and ascension.

This Week: As a family, read Acts 6:1–7:60.

Next Week: Acts 8:1–25

WEEK 30: *The Church is persecuted and the gospel spreads* • Acts 8:1–25

Principle: Believers must submit their lives to King Jesus.

Ask Your Child: How did the persecution of the church help the gospel spread?

Apply: By examining whether he or she has demonstrated true repentance.

This Week: As a family, read Acts 8:1–25.

Next Week: Acts 8:26–40



WEEK 31: Philip shares the gospel with the Ethiopian • Acts 8:26–40

Principle: God graciously allows people to hear His Word.

Ask Your Child: What did Philip tell the Ethiopian eunuch?

Apply: By knowing Scripture so that he can share the gospel.

This Week: As a family, read Acts 8:26–40.

Next Week: Acts 9:1–31

WEEK 32: Saul is converted • Acts 9:1–31

Principle: All people are God's enemies until they repent and enter God's family.

Ask Your Child: How did Saul demonstrate his faith in Jesus?

Apply: By being willing to suffer for Jesus while proclaiming Him to others.

This Week: As a family, read Acts 9:1–31.

Next Week: Acts 10:1–11:18

WEEK 33: The Gentiles receive the gospel • Acts 10:1–11:18

Principle: God saves all people who place their faith in His Son.

Ask Your Child: How did God show that He wanted Gentiles to be saved?

Apply: By praying for missionaries who are sharing the gospel.

This Week: As a family, read Acts 10:1–11:18.

Next Week: Acts 12:1–24

WEEK 34: God frees Peter from prison • Acts 12:1–24

Principle: The sovereign God blesses His servants but punishes His enemies.

Ask Your Child: Why did God punish Herod?

Apply: By believing that God works through prayer.

This Week: As a family, read Acts 12:1–24.

Next Week: Acts 15:1–35

WEEK 35: The Gentiles are saved by faith alone • Acts 15:1–35

Principle: Salvation is by faith alone and not by works.

Ask Your Child: What happened while Paul was in Jerusalem?

Apply: By being eager to see Christ's name glorified.

This Week: As a family, read Acts 15:1–35.

Next Week: Acts 16:16–40

WEEK 36: The Philippian jailer is saved • Acts 16:16–40

Principle: There is a joy that comes only through knowing Christ.

Ask Your Child: How did the jailer demonstrate that he had believed?

Apply: By making a list of the reasons why Christians can rejoice.

This Week: As a family, read Acts 16:16–40.

Next Week: Acts 17:16–34



WEEK 37: Paul preaches in Athens • Acts 17:16–34

Principle: Believers should follow Paul's example of obedience to Christ.

Ask Your Child: How did Paul show his commitment to Christ?

Apply: By imitating Paul as he obeyed Christ.

This Week: As a family, read Acts 17:16–34.

Next Week: Acts 27:1–44

WEEK 38: God protects Paul • Acts 27:1–44

Principle: Believers respond to the blessing of worship by submitting their heart to God.

Ask Your Child: What promise did God give Paul?

Apply: By rejoicing in promises that God has kept, is keeping, and will keep.

This Week: As a family, read Acts 27:1–44.

Next Week: Acts 28:11–31

WEEK 39: Paul testifies to the gospel in Rome • Acts 28:11–31

Principle: God sovereignly calls those He chooses through the power of the gospel.

Ask Your Child: How did Paul defend himself to the Jews in Rome?

Apply: By praying that God will give a missionary from your church boldness and the freedom to preach unhindered (Acts 28:31).

This Week: As a family, read Acts 28:11–31.

Next Week: Revelation 1:1–20



THE REVELATION OF JESUS CHRIST

WEEK 40: *John testifies to the exalted Jesus* • **Revelation 1:1–20**

Principle: Though trials and sufferings come, Jesus Christ continues to live, reign, and be faithful to His church.

Ask Your Child: Why was Christ's message to John and the seven churches encouraging?

Apply: By submitting to Jesus, who reigns as King and Lord over the entire universe.

This Week: As a family, read Revelation 1:1–20.

Next Week: Revelation 5:1–14

WEEK 41: *John sees the worthy Lamb* • **Revelation 5:1–14**

Principle: The risen Christ is worthy of all our praise.

Ask Your Child: How did everyone present respond to the risen Lamb?

Apply: By being eager to tell others about the Lamb who was slain and now is alive.

This Week: As a family, read Revelation 5:1–14.

Next Week: Revelation 19:11–20:15

WEEK 42: *God will judge the world* • **Revelation 19:11–20:15**

Principle: Christ will establish an earthly kingdom.

Ask Your Child: What will happen to those whose names are not found in the book of life?

Apply: By escaping God's judgment by believing in Christ and repenting of sin.

This Week: As a family, read Revelation 19:11–20:15.

Next Week: Revelation 21:1–22:21

WEEK 43: *God creates a new heaven and new earth* • **Revelation 21:1–22:21**

Principle: Believers should be encouraged by and preparing for the coming of Christ.

Ask Your Child: Why are Jesus' return and the new creation encouraging to believers?

Apply: By living a godly life as he eagerly waits for Christ's return.

This Week: As a family, read Revelation 21:1–22:21.



CHRISTMAS

WEEK 1: *The pre-existence of the Son of God* • **John 1:1–5**

Principle: Jesus is the always living God.

Ask Your Child: How is Jesus able to show us who God is?

Apply: By celebrating Christ's birth by submitting to the deity of Jesus.

This Week: As a family, read John 1:1–5.

Next Week: John 1:6–18

WEEK 2: *The incarnation of the Son of God* • **John 1:6–18**

Principle: Jesus became a man so that people can know God.

Ask Your Child: How is Jesus' glory just like the Father's glory?

Apply: By receiving Jesus, by wanting Him to come and be the boss of your life.

This Week: As a family, read John 1:6–18.



EASTER

WEEK 1: *The crucifixion of the Son of God* • **John 19:1-42**

Principle: Jesus died to finish His mission on earth.

Ask your child: Why did Jesus need to die?

Apply: By listing out some ways that Jesus' death fulfilled prophecy?

This Week: As a family, read John 19:1-42.

Next Week: John 20:1-31

WEEK 2: *The resurrection of the Son of God* • **John 20:1-31**

Principle: Jesus is the risen Lord..

Ask your child: How is a Christian's mission like Jesus' mission?

Apply: By imploring everyone to be reconciled to God (2 Cor 5:20).

This Week: As a family, read John 20:1-31.
