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
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Does Castor Oil Make Eyelashes Grow Longer? Here Are the Facts for 2022

"Castor oil moisturizes your eyelashes and can make them appear thicker and look like they have more luster," Dr. Haberman explains. "It's also possible that it can help prevent lash breakage which, in turn, can lead to healthier growth." The bad


Tl;dr, nope, castor oil won't grow your lashes. Sorry. But it's not all bad news.

news? Castor oil isn't going to give you the super-long lashes of your dreams. "There is no evidence that conclusively demonstrates that castor oil causes eyelashes to actually grow," says Dr. Haberman. Dermatologist Mona Gohara, MD, agrees: "Castor oil may help your lashes look thicker, denser, or fuller, but it won't help them grow." Womp, womp. But Dr. Haberman does add that some studies suggest that castor oil may reverse hair loss, which means it might,

possibly, maybe could help your current lashes stick around longer before falling

out. But if you're looking for concrete science, there just isn't any here.

you're after more instant long lashes, lengthening mascaras, false eyelashes, lash lifts, and lash extensions are some good alternative options. How long does it take for castor oil to grow eyelashes?

actually encourage growth, it just moisturizes and gives your lashes a coating that can make them appear thicker. If you start brushing on castor oil with a spoolie every night, in two to three weeks, you'll notice soft, hydrated lashes that aren't as prone to breakage-which is great! Listen: You have one set of eyes, so it's always a good idea to be extra, extra cautious when you're applying anything around them. Just like you wouldn't want your eye cream or your moisturizer to get in your eye, you don't want


castor oil there either, because it will definitely cause irritation, says Dr. Haberman.

The best way around that? Be very careful when you apply castor oil (more on that below) and take it slow. Wanna try a lash serum instead? Here are 4 good











Is castor oil safe for eyelashes? In general, yes, castor oil is safe for eyelashes, according to Dr. Haberman. But here's the thing: Because you're putting it so close to your eye, you still need to be super careful. "There's always a risk of irritation," says Dr. Gohara. She advises patch-testing the castor oil first by dabbing a small amount on your neck below

your ear, and then waiting a full day before using it near your eyelids to make sure

you won't have a reaction. How do I apply castor oil to my eyelashes? If you've accepted the fact that castor oil won't work to grow your lashes, but you still want to try it out for conditioning purposes, here's how to do it: Grab a clean

spoolie or a cotton swab and swipe a very small amount of oil along your lash line (again, being careful not to get it in your eye). Do it before bed, then remove

Is castor oil better than lash serum?

Whether you go with a lash serum or castor oil depends on what you're looking for.

it in the morning with warm water when you wash your face.

If you're looking for actual eyelash growth, stick with Latisse, but if you're looking to condition your existing lashes and keep them healthy, it won't hurt to give castor oil a try-but only if you promise you'll be careful not to get it in your eye. Or, you know, get your hopes up for actual lash growth.
