# Storage of Automotive Belts

Please keep the following in mind when storing belts.



Hang belts or place them flat on shelves. Do not put them directly on the floor.



Keep belts away from oil, grease and steam.



Do not bend belts or place heavy objects on them.



#### ■ NOTE

- 1. Use Mitsuboshi part number as indicated in application section only.
- 2. Make sure to use a Rawedge Cogged belt if "PART No." starts with RECMF.
- 3. Do not use new belts with old ones together as a set. It may cause belt breakage.
- 4. Agricultural V-belts and general industry V-belts are different from automotive belts structurally and cannot replace them.

## For Your Safety



### 🗘 Danger

- Do not use a belt as a lifting or towing tool.
- Make sure engine is turned off and at a complete stop before inspecting or replacing the belt.



## 🗥 Warning

- Always select replacement belts to match vehicle requirements. Belts are designed to be used only on the make and model for which they are designed.
- Carefully follow vehicle manufacture's step-by-step procedure when replacing the belt. Failure to follow manufacture's guidelines may cause engine damage.
- Do not expose belts to engine oils and other chemicals, which may cause belt deterioration.



### Caution

 Surface color of belts may change while storing, this will not affect the use or life expectancy of belts.
