Dye Sheet Instructions: Front Lace only

PLEASE READ THE SAFETY DATA SHEET

These are chemical Dyes. **Do not ingest or get into your eyes**. This dye will stain most things it comes into contact with, so please wear gloves, mop up any splashes and protect your clothing.

Once the fabric has been dyed and thoroughly rinsed it should not cause any allergic skin reactions.

You will need: Dye, Gloves, a Tea Spoon, Pot, to go on cooker, a Stirring Stick (like an old wooden spoon), Boiling water, Liquid Measurer

*The basic mix is - One pint of hot water to 1 level teaspoons of dye, (1 tablespoon = approx. 30gms.) Salt can be used as a fix (but this is optional)

From this standard mix you can change the amounts of water and dye to achieve different shades of colour. You will need to experiment to work out how to achieve the different shades required. Use small scraps of fabric to test colour on.

Make sure your water is boiling, then lower heat and keep it on a gentle simmer while the dye is absorbed into the net/lace. This can be anything from 1 to 3 minutes to 15 to 30 minutes, depending on the depth of colour you require.

Make sure the salt is dissolved in to the water before you add the dye powder.

COLOURS:

- Colour 2 Dark brown (Red Tones)
- Colour 3 Warm Mid Brown
- Colour 4 Dark Red Brown
- Colour 5 Very Warm Bright Orange (Use Sparingly)

Colour 6 - Yellow - to add yellow skin tones (Use Sparingly)
