TEACHERS INSTRUCTIONS

Have you ever stopped to think about what's in your lunchbox? Of course, we all like to plan yummy lunches but sometimes it's easy to forget the containers and throw-aways that come with our delicious nutritious food.

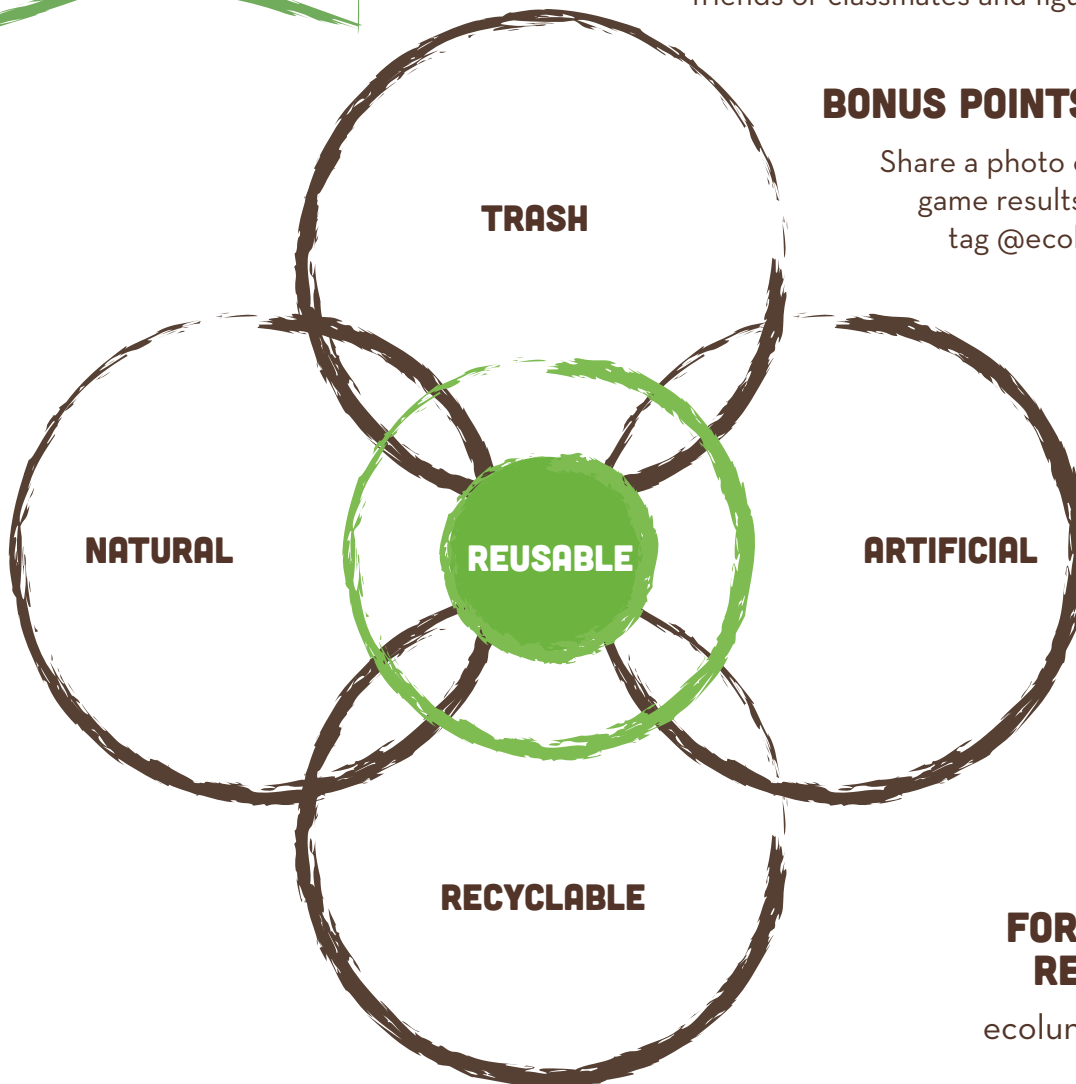
This is an activity that helps us think more about the waste and plastic that is generated at lunchtime. Have your students save the wrappers, utensils and containers from their lunch and bring back to the classroom.

IT'S AS EASY AS 1, 2, 3 | Step by Step Instructions

1. Lay out all the lunch containers, baggies, napkins, juice boxes, pre-packaged snack wrappers, empty plastic water bottles, reusable food containers and bottles, etc... Start with 10 or more items to make the game more challenging and fun!
2. Start trying to sort out the items and lay them on the board.
 - Find all artificial materials and place in the artificial circle.
 - Now find the recyclable materials.
 - You can move natural and artificial materials into the shared spaces between circles if they are both natural and recyclable or artificial and recyclable.
 - Now find everything that goes into the trash.
3. If you're not sure what goes where, talk with your friends or classmates and figure it out together.
