A celebrity favourite, Fisher makes fine jewellery that hovers between refined and street. Her gold cuffs are customizable with diamond numbers or letters, and the






FINN

Jade Trau's founder and creative director Jade Lustig takes advantage of her family's sixth-generation diamond knowledge to create modern and unique spins on classic pieces. Her Kismet rings are a fresh take on the eternity band—diamonds are spaced so they seemingly float on the finger—and her Forget-Me-Not collection of spherical lockets with room for multiple pictures are adorably sentimental. 


ALISON LOU

Alison Chemla—creative director and designer of New York-based label Alison Lou—has recently stepped out from the shadows of her bumper emoticon jewellery collection with a more refined floral line. The Secret Garden range features pansy earrings, rosebud question-mark necklaces, and the most heavenly daisy ring you can imagine: a whopping 11ct yellow sapphire




the while setting it in her signature blackened white gold. UK-based fans can contact the brand directly at evafehren.com—otherwise a trip Stateside is required

Yves Spinelli created his first set of connected rings in an attempt to make versatile and graphic jewellery. Six years later, the concept has evolved into jewel-studded interconnecting rings, which can be worn stacked up or stretched out; inexplicably feminine chain-link earrings; and chokers made with a trifecta of materials. ANITA KO

Affable and outgoing, Ko is the diamond darling of Hollywood. Anita's modern take on personal jewellery is exhibited via diamond-pavé lightning-bolt cuffs that seem to shoot through the earlobe; spider-web rings embracing a rose-cut diamond heart; and ultra-fine diamond line earrings that can be worn hanging like super-sparkly thread, or woven through and around huggies, studs and drop earrings.
