WARNING SIGNS FOR WOMEN TO BE AWARE OF:

- A passionate relationship that develops fast, and he promises you a better life if you run away with him.
- Someone who slowly pushes you away from friends and family has a controlling attitude that can include physical and sexual abuse towards you.
- You are asked to hand over money and/or documents.
- You are promised a solution to all your problems through glamorous careers or marriage.
- Someone is overly generous and brings you many gifts.

WARNING SIGNS FOR MEN TO BE AWARE OF:

- You have to hand in your original passport and documents.
- Your agent refuses to give you a signed contract or asks you to sign a contract in a language you can't read.
- You are asked to pay high fees for the "opportunity" to work in a particular job which sounds like a dream job.
- Your recruiter avoids answering all your questions or is reluctant to provide detailed information about the job, departure dates, etc.

WARNING SIGNS OF SOMEONE WHO IS SEXUALLY TRAFFICKED:

- They are living with their employer or at their work place. Poor living conditions.
- It's hard to contact her. She is superficial in what she shares. Can sound nervous or anxious.
- Answers appear to be scripted and rehearsed.
- Employer is holding identity documents.
- Signs of physical abuse.
- Submissive or fearful. Not free to travel.
- Unpaid or paid very little.
- Can't leave her job even if she wants to.

WARNING SIGNS OF SOMEONE WHO IS TRAFFICKED FOR LABOUR:

- Live in groups in the same place where they work and find it hard to leave. Poor living conditions.
- Lacking protective equipment for the work he does
- Poor access to healthy nutritious food.
- Unpaid or paid very little. No access to labour contract
- Work excessively long hours.
- Feel pressured by their employer to stay in a job or situation they want to leave.
- Owe money to an employer or recruiter.
- Do not have control of their passport or other identity documents.



THERE ARE MANY OTHER FORMS OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING, INCLUDING ORGAN TRAFFICKING. CHILD MARRIAGE IS ALSO CONSIDERED A FORM OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING, WHICH IS ILEGAL AND PUNISHABLE BY LAW.

HAVE YOU BEEN HURT OR THREATENED IF YOU TRIED TO LEAVE?

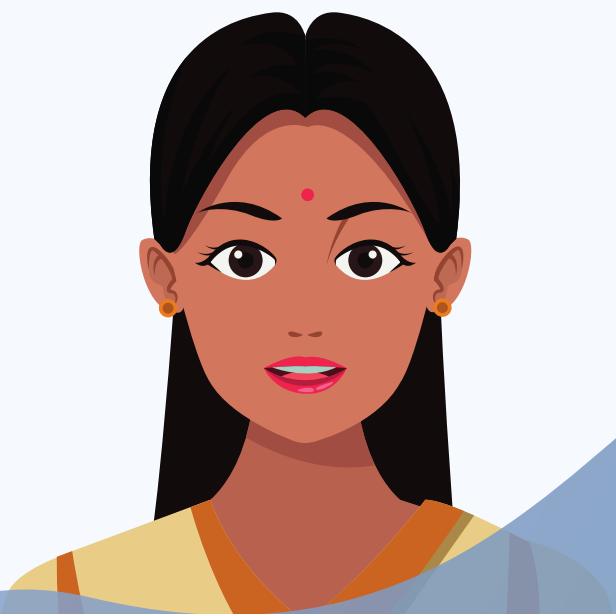
HAS YOUR FAMILY BEEN THREATENED?
