2015 - 2019 Subaru Outback Behind 2nd Row Seats Full Barrier Net Install

NOTE: Many newer models have B-pillar handles and even overhead on the ceiling that can be used for some of the top mounting locations. Check to see if you prefer to use these factory locations as the nets typically have enough adjustment to allow for this option. If your vehicle does not have handles in desired locations or you prefer to install mounting points for better fitment, please follow the below steps.

Paw Level:

Tools: *(may vary by vehicle)*

1. Panel Removal Tool
2. Drill Bit & Drill
3. Phillips head

Step 1

Uninstall the C pillar as shown.

*In many instances, it only requires loosening the trim for access. Your model may have slight variations.



Step 2

Mark drill holes for the footman mount. Drill and install hardware.



Step 3

Reinstall the C pillar.

*Helpful note: put a zip tie on the D ring part of the hardware to easily hold it out as you reinstall the C pillar panel.

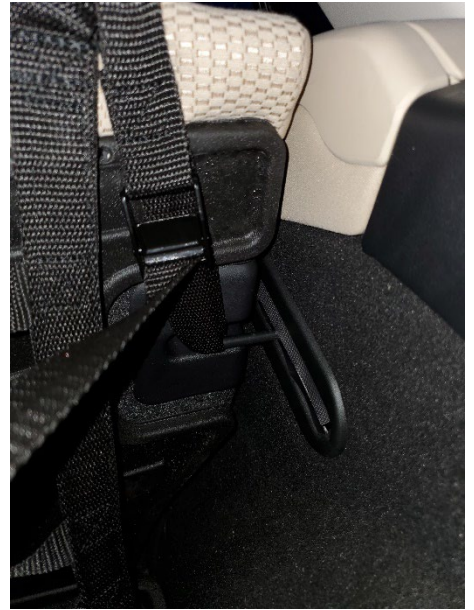
Step 4

With rear seat laying down, use the seat catch for the middle strap (Shown from passenger side looking toward the rear of the vehicle).



Step 5

Use the cargo hold ring in the floorboard for the bottom strap. Some models can attach the lower strap to where the seat pivot is.



Step 6

Run the top strap through the D ring hardware you installed in step 2.

Step 7

Repeat for other side.



Step 8

Tie up the loose ends

You can do this by feeding the end of the strap through the opening of the buckle to create a loop. Feed the strap through the loop, and the strap behind, continue until no strap is hanging.
