

# 2018 – Newer Ford Expedition and 1999 – 2005 Ford Excursion Behind 3<sup>rd</sup> Row Rear Seats Barrier Divider Net Installation

NOTE: Many newer models have B-pillar handles and even overhead on the ceiling that can be used for some of the top mounting locations. Check to see if you prefer to use these factory locations as the nets typically have enough adjustment to allow for this option. If your vehicle does not have handles in desired locations or you prefer to install mounting points for better fitment, please follow the below steps.

IMPORTANT: READ INSTRUCTIONS FULLY BEFORE STARTING

Time: approximately 50 minutes

Paw Level:



#### Tools:

- 1. Panel Removal Tool
- 2. Socket set including Large Torx sockets sizes T-45 to T-50
- 3. Wrench
- 4. Power Drill, drill bits, Phillips head bit

**NOTE:** Move rear seats forward for easiest access.

FOR BEHIND 3rd ROW: \*some models (depending on year and if equipped with power fold seats) will let you use the supplied triangular anchor plate (Part#C1015) at the top torx bolts (under the plastic pop off cover) or you may also use it at the lower points in Step two.

#### Step 1\*

The behind 3rd row barrier attaches up and above the upper rear seat belt shoulder slider on the ceiling. You can wrap the strap above that bolt cover shown here.



### Step 2\*

The lower straps may either use the supplied anchor plate or attach to any bracket that is free and clear of moving mechanisms when seat lowers or raises.







### Step 3

Tension top, lowers and then install the middle points. The "wings" on the sides do require that the stainless footman mounts be installed to the very sides of the plastic panel near the window. Double check under panel edge before deciding on final mounting location. Finally tension middle wings to draw out center.



### Step 4

Return seat positions and do final tensioning. The net can be removed, held down, or lifted as desired.

## Tie up the loose ends

You can do this by feeding the end of the strap through the opening of the buckle to create a loop. Feed the strap through the loop, and the strap behind, continue until no strap is hanging.
