AS I WRITE THIS NOTE, Canada is still in the midst of the worst wildfire season on record, with more hectares of land burned than ever before. Trying to understand how this could happen, and the urgent need to mitigate the impact of wildfires in the future, led to *The Summer Canada Burned*, a collaboration with Postmedia. A share of proceeds from the sale of the book is being donated to the Canadian Red Cross Wildfire Fund. We rushed the book out in late 2023, but have included it here again to ensure it gets the attention it deserves so we can learn from this devastating experience.

Many of our new Spring 2024 books encourage readers to look “beneath the surface of things” to see the familiar in a new light. THE ESSAYS IN this collection came about during the unhurried months when one who had traveled incessantly was obliged to stay still, even as events flared on all sides in a world that never stops moving. Wade Davis brings his unique cultural perspective to such varied topics as the demonization of coca, the sacred plant of the Inca; the Great War and the birth of modernity; the British conquest of Everest; the endless conflict in the Middle East; reaching beyond climate fear and trepidation; on the meaning of the sacred. His essay “The Unraveling of America,” first published in *Rolling Stone*, attracted five million readers and generated 362 million social media impressions.

The anthropological lens, as Davis demonstrates, reveals what lies beneath the surface of things, allowing us to see, and to seek, the wisdom of the middle way, a perspective of promise and hope that all of the essays in this collection aspire to convey.

WADE DAVIS is currently Professor of Anthropology at the University of British Columbia and was Explorer-in-Residence at the National Geographic Society from 2000 to 2013. His 23 books, published in 22 languages, include *One River*, *The Wayfinders*, and *Into the Silence*, winner of the 2012 Samuel Johnson Prize.

ANIMAL SENSES ARE finely tuned to their environments. Scientists have observed rats fleeing days before an earthquake and birds taking flight ahead of a tornado. What if we could tap into these secret movements all over the world? Would it change how we prepare for natural disasters, disease outbreaks, and even climate change? Meet “the internet of animals”—a living map of animal movements and behaviors that for too long went unnoticed by scientists, but is now known through a groundbreaking new satellite-based animal tracking system called ICARUS. ICARUS’s founder, Martin Wikelski, reveals what his research means for our future and the future of a planet in jeopardy. MARTIN WIKELSKI is the director of the Max Planck Institute of Animal Behavior and honorary professor of ornithology at the University of Konstanz. Previously, he was a research fellow at the Smithsonian Tropical Research Institute in Panama, assistant professor at the University of Illinois, and associate professor at Princeton.

KEITH GADDIS is the program manager for NASA’s Biological Diversity and Ecological Forecasting Program. An ecologist and biogeographer by training, he is a vocal advocate for the use of science in public decision-making.

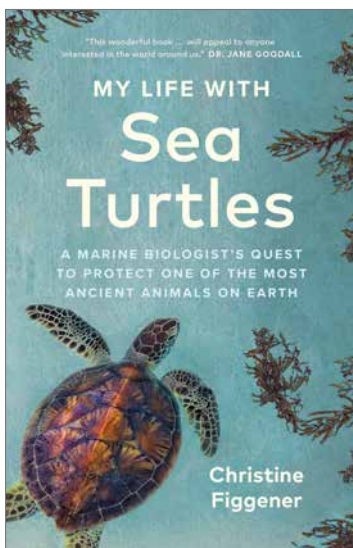

BY EARLY SEPTEMBER 2023, wildfires had devoured a record 16.5 million hectares of Canadian forest—more than six times the average usually lost to fire.
