



In the tradition of Michael Pollan and Anthony Bourdain, a far-reaching, globe-trotting account of ancient cuisines—and why reviving them is the key to saving the future of food.

THE LOST SUPPER explores an understanding that is quickly spreading among chefs, food producers, and scientists: that the key to sustainable eating lies not in looking forward, but in looking back to the foods—many of them forgotten or on the verge of extinction—that have sustained us through our half-million-year existence as a species. 


The disturbing legacy of mining is laid bare in this harrowing and well-researched account ending on a vision for a better industry—which will prove essential as we transition away from fossil fuels by digging for "green" metals.

MINING HAS LEFT a trail of devastation across the planet. Most of the copper, gold, and other metals we depend on come from countries in the global south, which bear the human and ecological consequences; the benefits go to "transnational" companies based in wealthy nations. Yet the push for green infrastructure means we need more metals than ever before. How can we transition away from fossil fuels without causing further harm?


To answer this question, journalist Christopher Pollon digs into the past, present, and future of mining. Through on-the-ground reporting and interviews with miners, activists, and executives, he uncovers how the industry leaves a wake of violence and ecological harm—and how growing movements for justice led by Indigenous peoples and national leaders are demanding change. Along the way, he highlights levers for accountability and argues that we need to radically rethink our approach to resource extraction.

CHRISTOPHER POLLON is an independent journalist who reports on the politics of natural resources, focusing on mining, oceans, and energy. His work has appeared in dozens of publications, including *National Geographic*, *VICE*, *The Walrus*, *The Tyee*, and the *Globe and Mail*. He lives in Vancouver, BC.

The Pig and I

A conflicted bacon-loving journalist labors for six months at an industrial pig farm in this compelling investigation into the long relationship between humans and swine.

IN THIS EYE-OPENING and lively book, journalist Kristoffer Hatteland Endresen follows a litter of piglets from birth, all in the hopes of understanding what goes on inside an industrial pig farm and whether humans can ethically justify eating pork. He mucks out pig pens, cuddles a piglet, and narrowly escapes being trampled. Drawing on history, literature, archeology, and myth, Endresen interweaves his piggery experience with surprising insights into the long and star-crossed bond between pigs and humans. Sharing new science on video-game-playing swine and pig heart transplants, he asks if pigs really are as smart as we think.


Both an engaging saga of an overlooked animal and a provocative exploration of the ethics of industrial meat, *The Pig and I* asks us to consider not only where our food comes from, but also the tangled history that first brought it to our plates.

Part "polemic, industrial history, nautical writing, elegy and ecology" (The Scotsman), The Two-Headed Whale charts the tragic history of the post-war whaling industry alongside the author's thrilling memoir of sailing the Antarctic.

IN 2016, Sandy Winterbottom embarked on an epic six-week tall-ship voyage from Uruguay to Antarctica. At the mid-way stop in South Georgia, her pristine image of the Antarctic was shattered when she discovered the dark legacy of twentieth-century industrial-scale whaling. Enraged by what she found, she was quick to blame the men who undertook this wholescale slaughter, but then she stumbled upon the grave of an eighteen-year-old whaler from Edinburgh whom she could not allow to bear the brunt of blame. There are two sides to every story.

The Two-Headed Whale vividly brings to life the spectacular scenery and wildlife of the vast Southern Ocean, set alongside the true story of Anthony Ford, the boy in the grave, as he sailed the same seas and toiled in an industry where profits outranked human life. Drawing together threads of nature and travel writing with an unflinching narrative of life onboard a whaling factory ship and the legacy it left behind, *The Two-Headed Whale* leaves us questioning our troubled relationship with the extraordinary abundance of this planet.

SANDY WINTERBOTTOM spent most of her career as an academic, teaching and researching in the environmental sciences at the University of Stirling. In 2010, she left to work in the renewables industry, but following a life-changing trip to South Georgia and the Antarctic in 2016, she returned to study and completed the creative writing masters program at Stirling, tutored by Kathleen Jamie. She lives near Muckhart in central Scotland.


