But books and television show them what seems to be a perfect solution—a place where there are seals but also penguins. So, they set off on another long journey.

Brought to life by one of the world’s greatest illustrators, Hans Christian Andersen Award winner Igor Oleynikov, this story of four bears trying to find a place to live delivers a thoughtful exploration of immigration and the importance of home.

DAI YUN is an author of children’s picture books. She grew up in Nanjing, China, studied and worked in Sydney, Australia, and currently lives in Singapore. Some of her most acclaimed books include *The Wandering Chicken* and *Sudan’s Horn*.

IGOR OLEYNIKOV is an illustrator and art director in animation. He has illustrated more than a hundred books for children and young adults, and was selected as the winner of the 2018 Hans Christian Andersen Award for Illustration.

A Few Tips Before You Set Off



This book is for you. Whether you want to browse through the pages at home first or take it with you right away, I hope you will have fun!

There is no special order to the adventures and activities in this book. I suggest you take a look and start with the ones you like best. It is wonderful to explore nature—and the more you learn about animals and plants, the more exciting your adventures will be.

We made this book small so you can review my suggestions quickly when you are outside. It will fit in your backpack, so you can always carry it with you.

Before you leave home, think about what you would like to look for on your next



adventure. Then pack what you need before you set off. I've included notes throughout about what items will help you when you are experimenting and exploring.

Make an entry in your notebook right away when you find something interesting. Some discoveries are worth bringing home to paste into a scrapbook or onto sheets of paper in a binder. Include the matching page number from this book when you record your find. This will make it easier for you to organize everything when you get home.

Because you will likely end up with a small scratch or two on your adventures, pack a few adhesive bandages in your backpack. And remember to bring something to drink!

Some outdoor expeditions work only at certain times of the year. Since there are different ideas for spring, summer, fall, and winter, you can use this book to go adventuring all year long.

Now it's time to get started! I have really enjoyed writing this book. I hope you will have lots of fun reading, experimenting, and learning about nature in your part of the world!

Listening to Tree Talk

Tree talk to one another.
And you can smell their conversation!



When a bark beetle lands on a tree to bore into its bark, the tree can feel it. The tree tries to get rid of the beetle by pushing a drop of sticky resin out of the hole the beetle is making. The beetle gets trapped and can't get any farther inside the tree.

Because trees react so slowly, they can defend themselves better if they have time to prepare themselves for the beetle attack. For example, trees can prepare themselves when they are warned by other trees. Trees detect either trees in danger using scent. Every scent means something different. There's a language based on scent! You can smell it too, especially on hot summer days. If you sniff the air under conditions you smell a sweet, spicy aroma—the stems call it trees.

Trees' needles spread the scent. Pick a few needles and rub them between your fingers. Notice how the small, brownish aroma? Pick needles only from trees that are not poisonous, such as spruce, pine, fir or Douglas fir.

The most poisonous species in the forest are yew trees. Their dark green needles, bark, and twigs are poisonous, so avoid them when you're outdoors.



In spring, you can even use needles from spruce or Douglas fir trees to make a smoothie. Fill a blender with fruit, some green like spinach or lettuce, a few fresh needles, and a bit of water. Blend well. And, there you have it—your tree smoothie!

Making a Tree Friend

What would it be like to have a tree for a friend?



Watch as "your" tree changes through the seasons. Most changes happen slowly. It'll take months for you to see the changes if you take photographs every so often and compare them later.


Look closely. When do the buds swell in spring? Are the tips of new leaves poking out from the buds? Does the tree have flowers? Does it produce fruit? Are new twigs gradually growing longer? When do the first leaves turn red or yellow in fall?

It's easy to do. Choose a tree you can visit regularly. It could be in a yard, in a park, or right outside your front door. It's most fun if you choose a deciduous tree—they usually have something interesting going on.
