#### **BEFORE YOU READ THIS BOOK:**

(All SnapWords® resources are available at child1st.com)

#### PHONICS:

- QU words: quart, quarter, quickly, quietly, quail, quilts, quacking, question, quick.
- Watch for Bossy R words: quart, jars, quarter, birds.
- Review final Y that sounds like E: candy, quickly, quietly.
- Words that end in -LY describe HOW you do something; they are adverbs.

Examples: quickly (come quickly), quietly (talk quietly), softly (sing softly), soundly (sleep soundly), slowly (walk slowly), warmly (greet warmly), sharply (speak sharply). Ask the child to be on the look out for more -LY words.

### **SNAPWORDS®:**

review from List B. Words used in this story: let, ask, him, be, into, any, many, last, saw, then, must, went, about, all, read, still, take (17 words).

#### **FOLLOW-UP ACTIVITIES:**

Sound spellings: QU, Bossy R, Y that sounds like E, -LY.


The child has completed all of List B SnapWords®, gained a lot of phonics skills, and mastered 22 more titles! Time to celebrate!
