SOUND SPELLINGS: Sounds /G/ spelled G & GG. Words: GIGGLE, GAGGLE, WIGGLE, STRUGGLE, JUGGLE, BIGGER. Notice the pattern of double letter + LE. IGH spelling for long I in the SnapWords® HIGH, LIGHT, MIGHT, RIGHT.

SNAPWORDS®: D Words: HIGH, LIGHT, MIGHT, RIGHT. G Words: BAD, DARK, DRY, ELSE. Teach the IGH words together by listing IGH words in a column and pointing out that when you see IGH you just say the long I sound. BAD can be sounded out easily. DARK has the Bossy R spelling AR as in "art, park, star," etc. DRY goes with "fry, try, pry, sty, fly, sly," etc. ELSE has the final /S/ spelled "SE." This matches words such as "house, mouse, horse, louse," and many more words.
