

BEFORE YOU READ:

SOUND SPELLINGS:

The target sound spelling is Short E spelled **EA** - head, **AI** - said, and **IE** - friend. Use the chart below to teach sound spellings, SnapWords® and suffixes all at one time. Refer to *Sounds & Their Spelling Patterns, 3rd Edition,* page 104 for a related spelling lesson.

SNAPWORDS®: LIST E: pleasure, pleasant, breath, hitch, please. LIST V: watch, catch.

SUFFIXES: TURE: capture, nature, pasture, gesture, posture, future, adventure, feature, creature. SURE: treasure, measure, pleasure. The URE suffix means "an act." Exposure is the act of exposing. Posture is the act of posing. Share the diagrams below.



PREVIEW: Scan the story, searching for SnapWords®, suffixes, and sound spelling words.


WHILE YOU READ:
