Some children need to move during their lessons to learn. By keeping their active body moving, they are able to focus better on the sight words they are learning. This game will help with overall sight words recognition.



- 5. Switch up the design of the hopscotch board and the SnapWords® cards that you use!









Motion: hold out right hand, palm up as though showing one object.

Language: "A. I have A doll, but she has four."







Motion: settle yourself in your spot. Language: "AT. I am AT home."




Motion: hold up hands, then move them together, interlocking fingers.





Motion: point thumb to own chest. Language: "ME. It's ME!"




Motion: stomp foot and speak emphatically. Language: "NO. I said, 'NO!"
