



BLOCK ASSEMBLY PROJECT USES PRECISE 1/4" SEAMS.
TEST YOUR SEAM ALLOWANCE BY CUTTING (2) 2-1/2" X
5" RECTANGLES. STITCH THEM TOGETHER ALONG THE 5"
LENGTH. AT THE MIDPOINT, MEASURE ACROSS THE UNIT.
IT SHOULD BE EXACTLY 4-1/2" WIDE. IF NOT, ADJUST
YOUR SEAM ALLOWANCE AND REPEAT.


Note: The arrows in the figures denote fabric direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

BLOCK ASSEMBLY

1. Sew (1) B 2" x 10-1/2" strip to each side of (1) A 10-1/2" square. Sew (1) B 2" x 13-1/2" strip to the top and to the bottom of the A square to make (1) Unit 1 square. Trim the unit to measure 12-1/2" x 12-1/2". Repeat to make (6) Unit 1 squares total.




2. Sew (1) C 1-1/2" x 12-1/2" strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square. Sew (1) C 1-1/2" x 14-1/2" strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 square to make (1) Block One square. Repeat to make (6) Block One squares.




3. Place (1) E 2-7/8" square on top of (1) F 2-7/8" square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square. Sew 1/4" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line. Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 2-1/2" square to make (2) Unit 2 squares. Repeat to make (24) Unit 2 squares total.








4. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to each end of (1) B 2-1/2" x 3-1/2" strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) B 2-1/2" x 3-1/2" strip to each side of (1) D 3-1/2" square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 9-1/2" Unit 3 square. Repeat to make (6) Unit 3 squares total.



5. Place (1) F 2-1/2" square on the bottom right corner of (1) H 4" square, right sides together. Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner. Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam to make (1) Unit 4 square. Repeat to make (24) Unit 4 squares total.







6. Place (1) F 2-1/2" square on the top left corner of (1) G 4" x 7-1/2" strip, right sides together. Sew across the diagonal of the small square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner. Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam.






- 7. Follow the diagram below for the seam direction to add an F 2-1/2" square to the upper right corner of the G 4" x 7-1/2" strip to make (1) Unit 5 strip.
- 8. Repeat Steps 6-7 to make (24) Unit 5 strips total.





9. Sew (1) Unit 4 square to each end of (1) Unit 5 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 5 strip to each side of (1) Unit 3 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 14-1/2" Block Two square. Repeat to make (6) Block Two squares total.




10. Sew together (3) I 1-1/2" x 14-1/2" strips and (2) F 1-1/2" squares, alternating them from left to right, to make (1) Block Three strip. Repeat to make (3) Block Three strips total.


QUILT ASSEMBLY

- 11. Sew together (1) Block One square, (1) I 1-1/2" x 14-1/2" strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) I 1-1/2" x 14-1/2" strip and (1) Block One square, in that order from left to right, to make Row One. Repeat to make Row Three.
- 12. Sew together (1) Block Two square, (1) I 1-1/2" x 14-1/2" strip, (1) Block One square, (1) I 1-1/2" x 14-1/2" strip and (1) Block Two square, in that order from left to right, to make Row Two. Repeat to make Row Four.
- 13. Sew together the (4) Rows from Steps 11-12 in numerical order and the (3) Block Three strips lengthwise and alternating them from top to bottom, to make the 44-1/2" x 59-1/2" Center Block.



BORDER ASSEMBLY MEASURE WIDTH AND LENGTH OF THE QUILT TOP TO ENSURE I AND J BORDER SIZES, BELOW ARE OUR CUTTING SIZES.

- 14. Sew (1) I 2" x 59-1/2" strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) I 2" x 47-1/2" strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 15. Center (1) J 11-1/2" x 88" strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a 1/4" from the top edge of the block and stop a 1/4" from the bottom edge. DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS. Repeat with the opposite side.
- 16. Repeat Step 15 to sew (1) J 11-1/2" x 73" strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start 1/4" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides.
- 17. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in diagram below), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a 1/4" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.



FINISHING Cut batting and backing 3" larger than top on all sides. Layer backing, batting and top together and baste or pin. When quilting is completed, trim excess batting and backing, Bind as usual.
