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# **2. WHAT IS PUTT18?**

**Putt18** is an interactive Golf Putting Game designed and created in Australia. The game consists of a registered patented design Putting Mat, Game Rules and Scorecards. The Mats have a series of simulated holes and starting points with every putt starting from different starting points. Essentially, we are creating a diversified and stimulating play environment. No two games are the same. The students are putting for an eagle on every hole. The mat is extremely versatile in that you can play strokeplay or matchplay, singles, pairs or even in teams of 4. Just like playing golf. **Putt18** even has a match index rating so you can play with up to maximum handicap of 18.

# 3. PUTT18 FOR SCHOOLS AGED 10-17

**Putt18** for Schools is a great interactive fun, easy to use activity that can be played both indoors and outdoors. **Putt18** is primarily tailored to Upper Primary and Lower Secondary School aged students. Not just a game but an experience using a unique scoring system. You will be able to cater to small or large numbers of children. You can tailor the games to suit younger and older children.

You can play 9 or 18 holes depending on the time available and the number of children you have playing the activity. **Putt18** has water hazards, sand traps and birdies, eagles and pars. The unique feature is that you can score like a round of golf, it's quick and easy to play, fun, and inclusive. Their scores can be kept on scorecards and even recorded onto a spreadsheet for further use in other class curriculum-based activities. You can even have a competition each day or week. They can score the game by themselves using the score cards and probably even make up their own rules sometimes.

# 4. WHY DOES PUTT18 WORK SO WELL?

**Putt18** works well because school age children have more refined gross motor skills and the cognitive skills to follow the logic of a game with rules. Sportsmanship and teamwork are explored through active play. As children learn to play team games, educators play a role in mentoring, role-playing and intentionally teaching the concept of sportsmanship, and how to deal with the difficulty of losing.

**Putt18** promotes cooperation, respect, consideration for the safety and wellbeing of others and encouragement to achieve both individual and team goals. **Putt18** also encourages team play and fun, but also to practice the skills of turn-taking, how to enter and exit play, as well as how to control impulses and manage feelings around winning and losing that are acceptable to the group.

School students enjoy social engagement with an easy to play sport. School Teachers like it because it promotes cooperation, respect of others and encouragement to achieve both individual and team goals. **Putt18** also has a STEM's element to the scoring.

### 5. CHILDREN AGED 6-9


For children between the ages of 6 and 9 we change the way they play slightly. The younger children have a different set of achievable and realistic goals. We have included a number of games that make the activity interesting and fun. The children have several games that register wherever the ball finishes. There is also a Native Animal Version available outlined below.

# 6. CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

**Putt18** can be used to compliment students with special needs. We have created a range of modified putters and putter sleeves for those students in wheelchairs. For special needs students we can incorporate large coloured balls, larger putters and large putting discs for indoor and outdoor use.

We can modify putters for individual students. This depends largely on the size of the chair, their physical strength and any movement limitations of the person. Please ask for our fitting template should this be of interest. It's been our experience that either using the putter from the side of the chair, from between their legs or from above the knees has the greatest success. This also depends on arm/shoulder movement and strength. For younger children and children with special needs we have created a Native Animal Version of **Putt18** with the goal to collect as many Native Animals as they can using the Game Print Outs. Children Can mark off the sheet when they land on a corresponding animal.

# 13. SETTING UP PUTT18

- 1. Select an area that is appropriate in size. This will depend on the kit you have purchased.
- 2. Remove the Putting Mats from the bag
- 3. Remove the Putters
- 4. Unroll the matting so the + 3 Water End is facing away from you and ideally against a wall.
- 5. The soft golf balls are located within the black pouch. Remove the golf balls and place them onto the matting at the starting end. The starting end has 6 rectangle areas or starting points.

# **14. BEFORE COMMENCING**

- 1. Please read the Risk Management Plan.
- 2. Select the game you will be playing.
- 3. Use the supplied score cards, or print, available online at <a href="https://www.putt18.com.au">www.putt18.com.au</a>
- 4. Arrange the children into groups on each mat and in a queue behind each mat. Leaving a 1 metre gap between the person putting and the next putter.
- 5. Each child will need to understand that putting does not require strength or power before putting. To do this, a visual and verbal teacher instruction should be delivered prior to commencement and with any new child unfamiliar to the game.

# **15. PLAYING PUTT18**

- 1. The children at the front of the queue will have a putter each. After having their turn, they should give the putter to the child behind them and then pick the balls and place them on the rectangle squares for the next players to use. Their score is recorded by the child behind them. (As a rule please ensure that each child hands back the putter to the next child in line)
- 2. Children will grip the putter in a number of ways. The children will be either left or right handed and the putters are designed for both left and right handed putters.
- 3. To ensure longevity of the mats, please roll the matting with the backing on the outside. Place the matting into the bag/s. Place the soft golf balls into the pouch.

# 19. PUTT18 OFFICIAL RULES

**PUTT18 RULES: Putt18** is a fun and easy to play interactive putting game. Unlike the retail version of the product, when you play in a School Hall with multiple players, there are no Wildcards used.

**RULES OFFICIAL:** Appoint a Rules Official who will also be the Official Scorer (Teacher). This person must be unbiased and be able to fulfil their obligation throughout the entire event. The Rules Official must be fair, realistic and honest when scoring, making decisions regarding players conduct and overseeing a playoff. **The Rules Officials decision is final.** 

**THE EVENT:** Individual Stroke Play is the most common event that is played in Schools. Decide if the event is to be 9 or 18 holes, singles pairs or teams or 4. You may wish to use a **Putt18** Leader Board to display scores, however in the event you do not have the **Putt18** Leader Board just use the scorecards provided to keep the scores and the **Putt18** scoring sheet.

**STROKEPLAY:** Each player or team has 9 putts for a 9-hole event or 18 putts for an 18-hole event. You only get one putt at each hole. The lowest total score at the end wins. Your score is determined by where the ball finishes.

**MATCHPLAY:** Each player or team has 9 putts for a 9-hole event or 18 putts for an 18-hole event. Simply select your opponent or opposing player/teams. Lowest score always putts first. Match play is played hole by hole. In Matchplay player one putts one ball and then player two putts one ball.

Player 1 putts and then removes their ball allowing their opponent to putt to the same hole. The player with the lowest score wins the hole. That player is then one up. Holes are halved by both players when they have the same score. To win in Match Play the player wins when He or She is more holes up than He or She has left to play.

**STARTING POINTS:** The starting points are defined by 6 rectangular starting blocks. To start place a ball at the 1-3 hole block and commence putting. You will putt 3 balls from this spot. Your first putt will be at the hole Par 4, your next putt will be at the Par 5 and the next will be at the Par 3.

**SEQUENCE:** In Stroke Play ideally two players or team should be playing at the same time. Player or team one putts three balls then player or team two putts three balls. Move to the next block 4-6 and so on. A player or team's ball must be placed within the starting blocks before they putt.

Should a player or team place their ball in front of or outside the rectangular starting blocks and putt, then the putt must be replayed, and the player or team shall incur a One Shot Penalty or Loss of Hole in Match Play. The hole order of play is always the same when playing stroke play or matchplay and always moves in a clockwise direction. **The order of play is listed on the score card. Par 4, Par 5 then Par 3**. No Two Putts Are Ever the Same.

# **PUTT18 OFFICIAL RULES (CONT)**

**SCORING:** Balls coming to rest within the following areas score the following points:

- Blue circle you have scored a Par
- Red circle you have scored a Birdie or -1
- White circle you have scored an Eagle or -2
- Anywhere on the Green matting you have scored a Bogey or +1
- In a Bunker you have scored a Double Bogey or +2
- In a Water Hazard you have scored a Triple Bogey or +3
- Putting off the matting surface will score a Triple Bogey or +3

**PLEASE NOTE:** If a player or team putting on any hole manages to bring the ball to rest in either of the two holes not in play, then that shot shall be deemed as a **Bogey** or **+1** for that hole.

**SUDDEN DEATH PLAYOFFS:** All ties are decided by a 3-hole playoff. All 3-hole playoffs are decided the following way. Should there be a tie between two players or two teams a toss of a coin will decide who plays first. The toss winner putts first. Three holes must be played in the following order. Hole 1 then hole 2 then hole 3. The lowest combined score over the three holes wins. Should the scores still be tied **Sudden Death Palyoff** will decide the winner. The players return to the first hole and play hole by hole until a winner is determined. The Player or Team that lost the initial toss will now putt first and their opponent will follow starting from the first hole and continuing in scorecard hole sequence. Eample: Holes 1,2,3 etc. The player or team that putts a lower score on the hole being played will be determined the winner.

**During a 2 person** team 3-hole playoff, one person is nominated to represent the team. Should the scores be tied after a 3 hole play off, the 2<sup>nd</sup> player plays hole by hole until a winner is determined. The first to putt being the player or team that lost initial toss. **See Above.** 

**During a 3 person** team 3-hole playoff each player plays one hole each and if there is still a tie, the team then chooses one player to will represent them in a Sudden Death Playoff. Again the team that lost the initial toss will putt first. **See Above.** 

**During a 4 person** 3-hole playoff, three people are nominated to represent the team only. Each player plays a hole each. Should there be a tie then the remaining player must represent the team in a Sudden Death Playoff. Again the team that lost the initial toss will putt first. **There are No handicaps and No Wild Cards used in a 3-Hole or Sudden Death Playoff.** 

**THE ROGERS ROLLBACK BAR:** The Rogers Roll Back Bar is available upon request. The Rogers Roll - Back Bar is placed at the end of the matting to create a ramp. If a putt is hit slightly harder than required the ball should roll back onto the putting mat surface. Ensure the Rogers Rollback Bar is placed under the Mat.

**PENALTIES:** Interfering with the putting surface while a player or team is putting will result in a One Shot Penalty or Loss of Hole in Match Play or even disqualification if interference is repeated after a number of warnings. If a player is not available when it is their turn to putt, they may be disqualified.

**LINE BALL:** If the ball comes to rest and it is determined by the Host that the ball is on the line, then the player or team has the option to take the higher value or replay the putt.

# 20. PUTT18 - PUTTING GAME

**SUMMARY** 

Speed Ranking = Medium/Long Game

Difficulty = Easy

Age Range = 8 to Adults

This is the signature game. Select whether you are playing 9 or 18 holes. Each player putts 3 balls from any of the starting areas. Players putt the first ball to the Par 4, then the next ball to the Par 5, then the next ball to the par 3. The scores are kept using the **Putt18** scorecards. If playing 9 holes then the player repeats this 3 times to complete 9 holes. If playing 18 holes each player repeats this 6 times to score 18 holes. Players can choose to putt from each of the starting areas 1-3, 4-6, 7-9, 10-12, 13-15, 16-18. Children with the lowest 3 scores can be awarded 1st 2nd and 3rd place.

### **OUTLINE OF PUTTING COMPETITION: Single Stroke Format**

### 9 or 18 HOLE GAMEPLAY

# 3, 6 or 9 Mat Kit - Putting Format

- Event Duration is usually 30 to 40 minutes depending on the number of students.
- Set up the mats so that the end of the mat facing a wall.
- Ensure that the mats are evenly spaced leaving enough room for players to putt.
- Place one putter and 3 soft golf balls on each putting.
- Ensure that each student places their name of the student individual summary sheet.
- Explain the scoring to the group.
- Separate the students into teams. A maximum of 4 players per mat is ideal.
- Hand out the team scorecards.
- Have the students create a team name.
- Have the students write their names on the cards.

# • Scoring:

- The Student on the Putting Mat will putt 3 balls whilst the student behind writes down their score on the scorecard
- The Putter is handed to the next student and he balls are then picked up and placed in front of the next person
- The student then retreats to the end of the team awaiting their next 3 putts
- The student behind the person on the Putting Mats hands the scorecard to the person behind them and so on.

### **On Completion: Suggestions Only**

- The lowest 2 players plus ties play in a 9 or 18-hole final. Or Lowest 2 and Highest 2 play a final 9 or 18-hole final.
- The best team is awarded to the lowest average score. Calculated by the total team score divided by the number of players. Best two teams play a final 9 or 18-hole final

# 21. PUTT18 - TYPES OF GAMES

- 1. SELECT A TARGET
- 2. FAST 4
- 3. 6 or 9 PUTT
- 4. 6 or 9 MATCH UP

# **GAME 1 - SELECT A TARGET**

# SUMMARY Speed Ranking = Fast Game Difficulty = Easy Age Range = 6 and Up

The idea in this game is that each child takes turns to putt 3 balls from any of the starting areas to a single target. In this case we have chosen the **BLUE PAR** area as the goal. Alternatively you can select a smaller (harder) target **RED -1** area and the same scoring applies.

The player that putts

- 1 ball into the **BLUE PAR** area wins a prize
- Total of 2 balls into the BLUE PAR area wins a second prize
- Total of 3 balls into the BLUE PAR area wins a third prize

### GAME 2 - FAST 4

# SUMMARY Speed Ranking = Fast Game Difficulty = Easy and Hard Age Range = 6 and Up

Each child takes turns to putt 3 balls from any of the starting areas. Wherever the ball finishes that symbol is marked off the scorecard. Once a player has completed his or her scorecard then they have completed FAST 4. *Please note there are 2 versions of FAST 4. Easy and hard.* 

### GAME 3 - 6 or 9 Putt

# SUMMARY Speed Ranking = Medium Game Difficulty = Easy Age Range = 6 and Up

Each child takes turns to putt 3 balls from any of the starting areas. Using the 6 or 9 Putt Scorecard, the scorer marks off where the balls finish on the scorecard. You can choose to complete the game once a number of lines are completed or once the entire card has been completed.

# GAME 4 - 6 or 9 Match Up

SUMMARY
Speed Ranking = Medium/Long Game
Difficulty = Easy
Age Range = 6 and Up

Each child takes turns to putt 3 balls from any of the starting areas. Using the 6 or 9 Match Up Scorecard, the scorer marks off where the balls finish on the scorecard. You can choose to complete the game once a number of lines are completed or once the entire card has been completed.

# **Different Putter Grips:**

When it comes to putter grips there really is no right or wrong way. The goal is to find a grip that you feel comfortable with that will help keep the Putter Face square to the target during impact. Becoming a good putter is having an awareness of how hard you need to hit the ball before you actually hit the ball. This becomes easier with practice. The key to making the ball travel a certain distance is, understanding the relationship between your putter stroke length and the putter stroke speed or tempo.

Grip pressure is also important. The grip pressure is one key in providing great feedback. Experiment with grip pressure to find what works best for you. Soft hands are generally better than strong.
