A Joyful Mozart Canor is based upon the opening theme of the Laudate pueri from Mozart's Vesperae de Dominica, K. 321. This arrangement is appropriate for performance by both school and church choirs. When used in worship, suggested corresponding ectionary readings include Psalm 95, John 12: 9-19, and Romans 5: 1-11 and 11: 33-36. One basic homitetical theme is singing joyful praise.

This delightful canon is best performed with an articulate legato and clear articulation of each overlapping voice part. Rehearse the entire anthem on staccato "doo" until the voice parts are clearly delineated and the ensemble is precisely aligned.

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart composed his Vesperae de Dominica in Salzburg in 1779, where he was serving as court and carried organist. It was originally scored for SATB choir, orchestra and organ.
