FOREWORD

Creation! A Children's Musical About the Birth of the Earth from Adam to Noah is adapted from the first nine chapters of the book of Genesis. The story is told by a parent who shares the wondrous story of God's new creation while comforting a child on a dark, stormy night. It is intended to instruct children in the biblical story of creation, from the beginning of the world to its re-creation after Noah and the Great Flood. Important lessons are also reinforced: humanity's responsibility for the environment; living as servants of God; the redeeming power of prayer.

This musical is designed for flexibility of teaching and staging. Presented as written, it may be performed by children's choirs with as few as 15 voices. However, the authors encourage teachers to freely adapt the characters and song assignments to meet their individual needs. For example, it may be performed by entire Sunday Schools with the assignment of individual songs to specific grade levels. Characters may be more fully developed through the creation of additional dialog and the assignment of individual songs to soloists rather than to all voices. The role of Mom can be changed to Dad and performed by a boy; if Mom's dialog is too long to be spoken from memory, create a "storybook" that contains a singer's edition of the musical, from which Mom can "read" the creation story to Jody. The role of Jody may be performed by either a boy or a girl (Jodi).

Staging can be as simple or elaborate as performance space and preparation time permit. For very simple productions, costume the children with a single article of clothing or with very simple make-up representing each character. More elaborate productions may employ more complete costumes and props, as well as simple backdrops. In both cases, the entire cast may remain "on stage" throughout the production. Sound effects such as the lightning, thunder, falling rain, and the ark rolling around in the storm may be improvised by "chorus" members on various rhythm or Orff instruments. Simple movement may be improvised and is highly encouraged, especially during the songs in which the animals enter and exit the ark.

CAST OF CHARACTERS AND COSTUMES

SPEAKING ROLES:

Narrator, Mom/Dad, Jody/Jodi, Noah, Ham, Shem, Japheth, Cat, Bear, Elephant

SOLO SINGING:

Mom/Dad, Jody/Jodi

NARRATOR:

An older child, a member of the junior or senior high choir, or an adult. This person may be dressed casually or costumed in a flowing robe decorated to represent "creation."

MOM/DAD:

An older child, girl or boy, a member of the junior or senior high choir, or an adult, dressed casually.

JODY/JODI:

A younger child, girl or boy, wearing pajamas or nightgown.

STUFFED ANIMALS:

Very young children—as few as three or as many as can comfortably be staged—costumed to represent typical stuffed animals: bunnies, cats, dogs, bears, dinosaurs, etc.

GOD'S FAMILY TREE:

(optional) Depending upon the number of children in the cast, some of them may be dressed as very old men, wearing robes and sandals and representing the different descendants of Adam. Both girls and boys may play these parts.

NOAH & FAMILY:

An older child, dressed as an old man, wearing a robe and sandals. Younger children may be assigned the roles of Ham, Shem, and Japheth, and may also wear robes and sandals. If necessary, the dialog of the three sons may be combined and assigned to only one son, Ham. Non-speaking roles may be created to portray the wives of Noah and his sons. Both girls and boys may play any of these parts.

ARK ANIMALS:

Depending upon cast size, a few pairs or many pairs may be created, including those for the speaking roles of CAT, BEAR, and ELEPHANT. Bear should wear a hat resembling that of a forest ranger's. Jody's stuffed animals also may join the animals' procession.

PROPS

A bed, or 2 chairs, with a bedspread or comforter

Narrator's podium

Choral risers or choir loft

Mom's storybook (optional)

Bear's forest ranger hat

THE ARK: This can be very simply constructed, one-sided, fashioned of cardboard or paper, which Noah and his sons can "finish building."

It should include a "door" through which animals and people can enter and exit, and which God can shut!

STAGE DIAGRAM

During the overture, all of the characters except Mom should take their places on stage: Narrator at the podium, Jody in bed, Jody's Stuffed Animals gathered around the bed, and the rest of the characters and singers on the choral risers (or in the choir loft). Mom should remain offstage until her cue. After Mom joins Jody in bed, both of them should remain there throughout the musical. Noah and his sons should come from the choral risers to stand in front of the ark for their scenes. Then, during the song **Two by Two — Enter the Ark**, they should collect the animal pairs from the risers (and Jody's stuffed animals, if necessary) and parade them around the stage until entering the ark. During the song **Two by Two — Exit the Ark**, the animals should exit the ark in pairs and parade back to the choral risers, with Noah and his family remaining in front of the ark through the finale.






