Foreword

Great hymns of faith and gospel songs have been a part of my musical journey for as long as I can remember. As a child, I learned the requisite Sunday school songs. At age 13, I began playing piano in my local church. While in college, I learned the discipline of arranging for contemporary Christian ensembles. As an adult, I've had the privilege of accompanying for many well-known Christian singers and producing recordings containing time-honored hymns and fresh new gospel songs.

I "cut my musical teeth" playing hymns in church and learned much about choral part-writing from studying them. More than any other type of music, sacred music has influenced my tastes in arranging and composition as well as my craft as a lyricist.

Because of this musical heritage, I am especially proud to add *10 Hymns and Gospel Songs* to my vocal solo series. This collection includes a wealth of hymn settings in both traditional and contemporary styles, favorite gospel songs and two new hymn tunes that I have written.

- **On Eagle's Wings**

This soothing, pastoral worship song has long been a favorite in Protestant and Catholic churches alike. Rich new harmonies and an extended last chorus give this classic new life. With a text based upon Psalm 91, this song has become a popular choice for performance at weddings and funerals.

- **Bright and Beautiful (A Children's Suite)**

This medley incorporates *Praise Him*, *All Ye Little Children*, *All Things Bright and Beautiful* and *Jesus Loves Me*, and would be perfect for any worship setting focused on children, parenting or education. The first song in the medley is set in a gently rhythmic manner, using mixed meter and a dynamic piano part. The first selection contrasts nicely with the lush harmonies and rubato style of the final song.

- **Take My Life, and Let It Be Consecrated**

In this arrangement, I have wed a new melody with a wonderful text by Frances Havergal. This new tune is memorable and gorgeous, the kind that you'll find yourself singing for days. Introspective, yet inspiring, this song is appropriate for dedication, consecration and renewal.

- **Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing**

Can you imagine this song in 5/4 time? This is your chance to experience it. This tune lends itself easily to the gentle syncopation of this irregular rhythm. The results are engaging and will evoke a sense of joy and thanksgiving. Use this arrangement as a concert opener or for an introit in worship.

- **Make Me a Channel of Your Peace**

The beloved prayer by St. Francis of Assisi inspired this singable, yet beautiful melody by Sebastian Temple. Sung at Princess Diana's funeral mass, this song holds a special place in the hearts of all who know it. The flowing, tasteful piano part is well suited to the serenity of the melody and to the profound lyrics. It is especially appropriate for peace services, weddings and funerals.

- **Lord of the Dance**

I've always loved this simple Shaker tune, which I first knew as *Simple Gifts*. Sydney Carter's classic lyrics bring the story of Jesus alive utilizing this familiar tune. I've set this arrangement with as much drama as I could, capitalizing on the narrative quality of the lyrics. Sing it in a lively manner, at times introspective, and at times passionately, communicating all the joy and sorrow that Jesus showed us in the remarkable dance of His life. *Lord of the Dance* is especially effective for Easter, Eastertide and Ascension.

- **Safe Within Your Arms**

I wrote this song after a significant devotional time many years ago. It speaks of vulnerability and the unconditional love of God. Wherever I sing this song, it has a powerful effect on the audience, and it continues to renew me as a songwriter and singer. Read the lyrics through first and let it touch any wounded places in your heart. Then sing this powerful combination of melody and text with as much vulnerability and honesty as you can. It will transform all who hear it.

- **Alleluia, Sing to Jesus (*Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus*)**

I have arranged the hymn tune *Hyfrydol* many times for solo piano and for choral voices, but not for solo voice. I never tire of this tune because the melody is a classic one and the possibilities for re-harmonization seem limitless. The first text makes this piece suitable for general worship and specifically for Ascension Sunday. An optional Advent text, *Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus*, is included as well, giving this arrangement a chance to be performed in more than one liturgical season.

- **Marchin' On Up (*Marching to Zion*)**

Take the old gospel hymn, *We're Marching to Zion*, add a healthy dose of black gospel style, put it in 4/4 time instead of 6/8, and you have a new song that can really "preach!" This soulful new setting will have your audience clapping along in no time. Its syncopated rhythms and bluesy piano accompaniment make it more than just another hymn arrangement. The repetitive vamp section and climactic ending are suitable for improvisation. Cut loose on this one!

- **Battle Hymn of the Republic**

This American classic has inspired people for years. When I sat down to arrange it for solo voice, I was aware of the need to portray the power of this legacy in my arrangement. Actually, there is so much drama in the lyrics that it was easy to paint this musical picture. As you perform this piece, be especially conscious of dynamic contrast and the ebb and flow of the tempo, utilizing every nuance at your disposal to heighten the text. If you are accompanying, look for orchestral touches throughout and play with that in mind. This setting could be thrilling concert closer or an obvious choice for patriotic occasions or peace and justice services.
