African Noel is a jubilant setting of a traditional African Christmas folksong. Arranged with optional percussion accompaniment (available separately, No. 19967), it is available in editions both for 3-part mixed voices and for unison or 2-part (treble or mixed) voices. It is appropriate for performance by both school and church choirs.

Call-and-response between soloist and choir is a notable element of this lively tune. The solo passages (e.g., mm. 49-52, 56-60, et. al.) may be sung by a single voice, several voices or the entire choir. The dynamics are carefully marked and should be observed with energy and excitement.

For performance by church choirs, suggested corresponding scripture readings include Isaiah 9: 1-7, Luke 2: 1-20 and Titus 2: 11-14. One basic homiletical theme is singing with joy and gratitude for the birth of the Newborn King.

Dave and Jean Perry live in Mesa, Arizona, where Dave retired after 28 years as a high school choral director and Jean teaches general music and chorus at Holmes Elementary School. They are both involved in the music ministry at First United Methodist Church in Mesa. Active as choral composers and clinicians, they have over 175 sacred and secular choral works in print and received the ASCAP special composer's award in 1999 and 2000.

PLEASE NOTE: In the InstruPax score and compact disc recording, the percussion part begins four measures before the keyboard entrance.
