
Performance time: approximately 20 minutes



NARRATOR:

Each year at Christmas we celebrate the miracle that happened long ago in a humble manger in Bethlehem. It was a night of wonder, of miracles, of Christmas magic!

Many people know the story of the miracle of the birth of Jesus. But few people know that each Christmas Eve another miracle occurs. The toys around the Christmas tree are granted the gift of life! For a few hours they move and speak, sharing the story of the birth of Jesus, gentle reminders of the true meaning of Christmas.



### AWAY IN A MANGER

(for keyboard and optional C-instruments and/or children)





NARRATOR:

In the house, all is quiet. Santa Claus has come and gone, and under the Christmas tree, dolls, soldiers, and teddy bears are ready for the children in the morning. On the far side of the tree is the baby Jesus in the manger, with Mary and Joseph, and the shepherds and three Wise Men who have come to worship Him. Quietly looking on is a small grey donkey.

It is the secret, magic hour!

### MAGIC MUSIC



NARRATOR: Let's watch the dolls as they come alive! They are the first to feel the Christmas magic.

DOLL 1: Listen to me! I'm talking all by myself!

DOLL 2: I can walk! Watch!

DOLL 3: I can turn my head back and forth, (looks from side to side) back and forth, back and forth

Never mind that. Watch me skip! (skips to the front of the manger) Oh, look! Come and see what I found!

DOLL 1: It's a baby! What is he doing here?

NARRATOR: The toy soldiers feel they really must take charge of the situation.

SOLDIER 1: I guess they are new this year. Don't they know who He is?

SOLDIER 2: I guess those new dolls don't know what Christmas is all about.

SOLDIER 1: Well, we'd better tell them who He is. (to the dolls) That is the baby Jesus.

SOLDIER 2: And tomorrow is His birthday!

NARRATOR: The teddy bears, knowing that they are filled with more magic than any other toy, feel

qualified to talk.

TEDDY BEAR 1: We know all about the baby Jesus.

TEDDY BEAR 2: Yes, His mother's name is Mary.

TEDDY BEAR 3: And His father is Joseph.

TEDDY BEAR 1: (to the dolls) Don't you know the story about the baby Jesus?

NARRATOR: Now every story needs a story teller. And this one is no exception — especially since this

is the most wonderful story of all.

STORY TELLER: This story begins long ago, in a far-off land. There was a decree that all the

world should be enrolled. And Joseph went to the city of David with his wife Mary, who was great with child. For the journey, Mary rode on a small grey

donkey that carried her slowly and carefully along the dusty road.

STORY TELLER: And lo, the star, which was in the East, came and stood over where the young child was.




## I BRING THE LIGHT

NARRATOR: The Toys Listen to the story of the baby Jesus with wonder and delight.


SOLDIER 1: The wise men brought gifts. Maybe we also could bring a gift to the baby.

(Soldiers)








NARRATOR: The Teddy Bears certainly don't want to be left out. What do they have to bring?



#### **COMPOSER NOTES**

My plays grew from a need for school performances and are really an extension of my teaching. Performing not only provides a source of pride and pleasure, but it also can bring out abilities that the children themselves didn't know they had. So with great respect and admiration for the talents of these little people, I have tried to create a performing medium for this age group.

CHRISTMAS MAGIC is a story that reinforces the true meaning of Christmas. In this tale I have incorporated the tradition of Christmas gift giving with the biblical Christmas narrative. Using symbols to which the children can readily relate, this musical play tells the story of the birth of Jesus through the toys that each Christmas Eve are magically granted the gift of life.

CHRISTMAS MAGIC is intended as a flexible musical for groups of any size. While a children's choir of 15 singers can successfully perform it, this musical also may be staged by the entire church school. Each class can be assigned a different song, singing along with the characters. The narration was written specifically for young children, and all characters are on stage throughout the play. Lynn's illustrations are an excellent basis for costuming and staging ideas.

My major concern is to provide a speaking or singing part for every child who desires one. Don't hesitate to add characters or to write new lines. Always remember that the children are a wonderful source of ideas and that using their ideas will make the play truly theirs.
