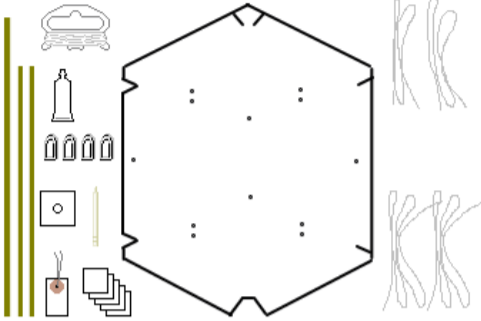




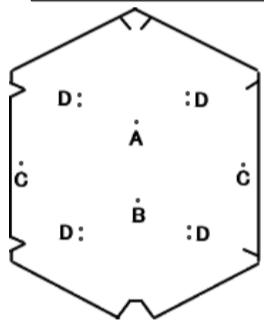
Rokkaku

Materials

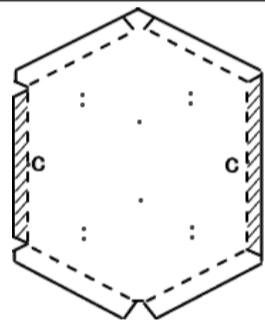


- Check the contents
- Japanese paper 1 pc
 - Center spar (bamboo) 1 pc
5mm x 2.5mm x 62.5cm
 - Horizontal Spar (bamboo) 2 pcs
4mm x 2.2mm x 47.5cm
 - Paper tape 5 pcs
 - Paper with a hole 1 pcs
 - String 1.8m long 2 pcs
 - String 75cm long 2 pcs
 - Cap with hook 4 pcs
 - Toothpick, Tag 1 each

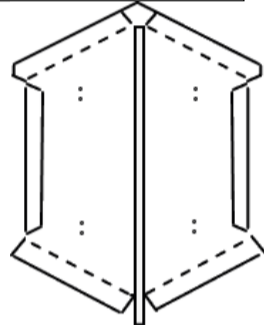
How to make the Rokkaku



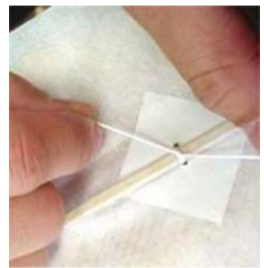
A: Mark of center line
B: Mark of center line
C: Mark of folding inward
D: Bridles



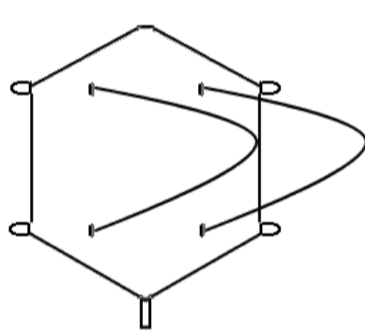
Fold the shaded portion inward and glue it.



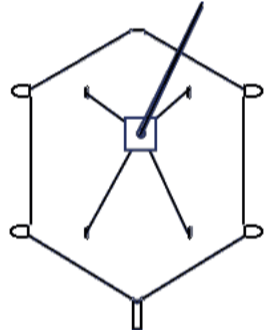
Attach the center spar to paper with glue.
(Do not attach the bark side of the bamboo)



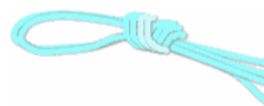
Leaving about 5cm, secure with knot. It is preferable to secure the knot with a drop of glue for safety.



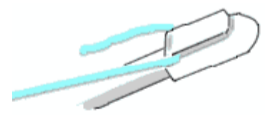
Tie string at the bridle top and the bridle bottom, shown as above.



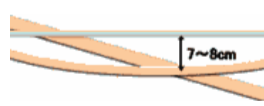
Pass the bridles through a paper with a hole. The paper with hole should be positioned at the "A" mark.



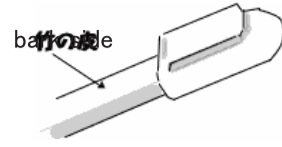
Tie the tip of the bridles and make a loop. Tie the flying line to this loop.



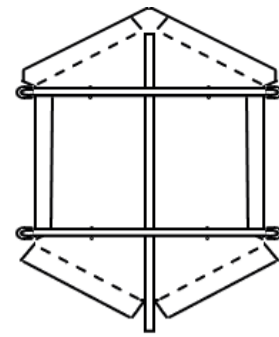
Tie the bow line(75cm string) to the hook.



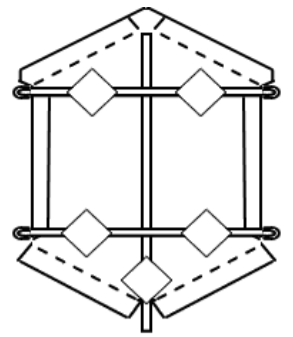
The bow should be 7~8cm at its maximum point.



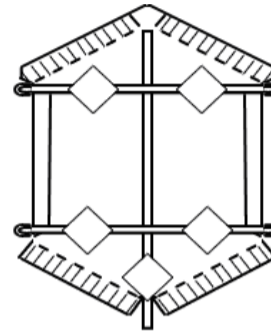
Cap both sides of the horizontal spar so the bark side of the bamboo meets the hook side of cap.



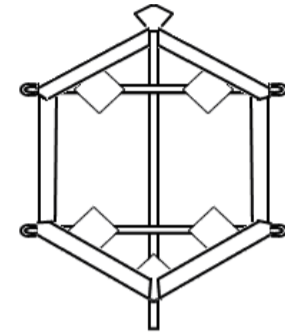
Attach the spars to the paper with glue. (Do not attach the bark side)



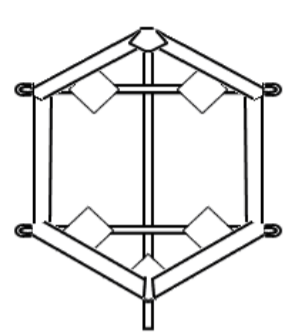
Fix with the paper tapes at five places where the pin holes exist and at the bottom corner. Dip the paper tape to water when fixing.



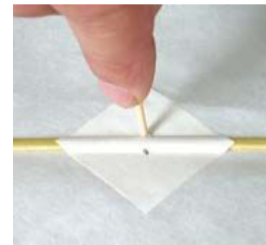
Fold the shaded portions inward and glue them.



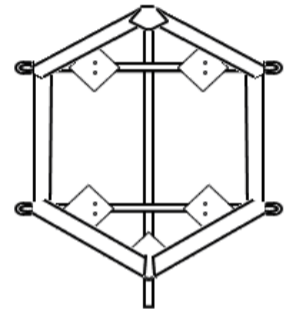
Fold the top corner inward and glue it.



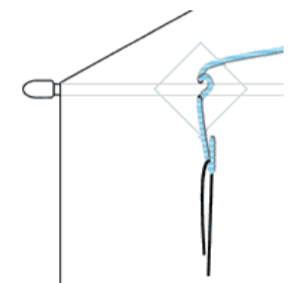
Let's attach the bridle.



Punch holes at the position D



Turn the kite face up.



Take off wire from the tag and use the wire (substitute for needle). Use 1.8m string. Put each string through each hole and around spar.
