Lasts

A last is the mold that the upper leather is pulled-over when being made.
It dictates the shape and fit of the shoe.

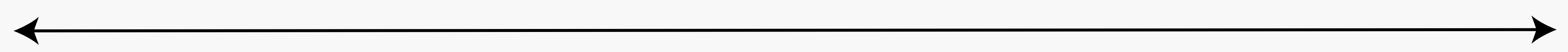

Widths

When grading widths, the length is also adjusted to hold the correct proportions. For example, an individual who wears **10.5D** comfortably would wear a **10E** or **9.5EEE**.

D - Medium width

E - Wide width

EEE - Extra wide

An **E width** is only slightly longer but over half a size fuller. The E width is perfect when looking for a little extra room in the instep or ball area/toe box.

The **EEE width** is significantly fuller in the instep and ball area, ideal for those who find most footwear overly narrow or pinching their forefoot.

Fitting Notes

- There should be room in front of the toes; 3/4 inch - 1 inch is common.
- When checking fit, refer to the ball or widest part of the foot. It should be sitting in the widest part of the shoe. The heel to ball fit is most critical.
- Avoid wearing a size that is tight, requiring the shoe/boot to stretch. This can cause discomfort long-term.
- If there is uncomfortable pressure on the instep or toe box area, consider going up half a size or width.
- Inquiries around heel slip are common with Goodyear-welt footwear. Most of the materials are substantial leather components that take time to break-in, conforming to the foot. Minor heel slip improves with wear.
