# Flying Geese Throw

FREE KNIT PATTERN

# Flying Geese Throw



**TYPE:** Knit

**DESIGNER:** Amy Gunderson for Premier Yarns

**FINISHED MEASUREMENTS:**

**Width:** 50"

**Length:** 60½"

**GAUGE:**

18 sts x 32 rows = 4" in Garter stitch

**Save time, check your gauge.**

**MATERIALS:**

[Premier® Yarns Colorfusion™ DK \(100% Acrylic; 3.5 oz/100g, 325 yds/298m\)](#)

- C1: 1196-04 Neapolitan – 5 balls
- C2: 1196-05 Blue Jeans – 5 balls

**NEEDLES & NOTIONS:**

- US Size 5 (3.75 mm) 40" circular *or size needed to obtain gauge*
- Tapestry needle

## SKILLS/TECHNIQUES USED IN THIS PATTERN:

- Knit stitch.
- Changing colors with intarsia.
- Slipping stitches.
- Seaming with mattress stitch.

## PATTERN NOTES

This throw is made up of 5 panels that are knit separately and then seamed together. Change colors using the intarsia method. Use a separate ball of yarn for each color section. When switching colors bring the new color up and around the old color to avoid holes forming in the work. For an uninterrupted look, try to begin the left-hand sections of C1 in the same spot of the color repeat as the right-hand sections. Be sure to keep unused strands on the wrong side of the work.

## THROW

### PANEL (MAKE 5)

With C1, cast on 45 sts.

### BEGINNING EDGE

**Rows 1-4:** Sl 1 pwise wyif, knit to end.

### TRIANGLE 1 (SEE PATTERN NOTES)

**Row 1 (RS):** With C1, sl 1 pwise wyif, k1, with C2, k41, with a separate ball of C1, k2.

**WS Rows 2-40:** With C1, sl 1 pwise wyif (here and throughout), knit to color change, with C2, knit to color change, with C1, knit to end.

**Row 3:** With C1, sl 1, k2, with C2, k39, with C1, k3.

**Row 5:** With C1, sl 1, k3, with C2, k37, with C1, k4.

**Row 7:** With C1, sl 1, k4, with C2, k35, with C1, k5.

**Row 9:** With C1, sl 1, k5, with C2, k33, with C1, k6.

**Row 11:** With C1, sl 1, k6, with C2, k31, with C1, k7.

**Row 13:** With C1, sl 1, k7, with C2, k29, with C1, k8.

**Row 15:** With C1, sl 1, k8, with C2, k27, with C1, k9.

**Row 17:** With C1, sl 1, k9, with C2, k25, with C1, k10.

**Row 19:** With C1, sl 1, k10, with C2, k23, with C1, k11.

**Row 21:** With C1, sl 1, k11, with C2, k21, with C1, k12.

**Row 23:** With C1, sl 1, k12, with C2, k19, with C1, k13.

**Row 25:** With C1, sl 1, k13, with C2, k17, with C1, k14.

**Row 27:** With C1, sl 1, k14, with C2, k15, with C1, k15.

**Row 29:** With C1, sl 1, k15, with C2, k13, with C1, k16.

**Row 31:** With C1, sl 1, k16, with C2, k11, with C1, k17.

**Row 33:** With C1, sl 1, k17, with C2, k9, with C1, k18.

**Row 35:** With C1, sl 1, k18, with C2, k7, with C1, k19.

**Row 37:** With C1, sl 1, k19, with C2, k5, with C1, k20.

**Row 39:** With C1, sl 1, k20, with C2, k3, with C1, k21.

**Row 41:** With C1, sl 1, k21, with C2, k1, with C1, k22.

Break C2.

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## TRIANGLE 1 CONT.

**Rows 42-44:** Sl 1 pwise wyif, knit to end.

## TRIANGLES 2-11:

Rep Rows 1-44 of Triangle 1, 10 more times.

Bind off all sts with C1.

## FINISHING

Lay the first panel out with cast-on edge facing you. Lay the next panel out with the bind-off edge facing you. Alternate the remaining three panels in the same way, so the triangles are pointing opposite directions every other panel using photo as a guide. Join panels together with C1 using mattress stitch.

Weave in ends and block.

<b>C</b>	color
<b>Garter st</b>	garter stitch: knit every row
<b>k</b>	knit
<b>pwise</b>	purlwise
<b>RS</b>	right side
<b>sl</b>	slip
<b>sts</b>	stitches
<b>WS</b>	wrong side
<b>wyif</b>	with yarn held in front
<b>rep</b>	repeat
