FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Width: 32" Length: 36"

MATERIALS

<u>Premier® Yarns Fable®</u> (90% Acrylic, 10% Polyester; 7oz/200g, 131yds/120m)

• 2142-08 Dragon – 5 balls

HOOKS & NOTIONS

- US Size M-13 (9 mm).
 crochet hook or size
 needed to obtain gauge
- <u>Tapestry needle</u>

GAUGE

• 4 blocks x 4 rows = 4" in pattern stitch

Save time, check your gauge.

SKILLS/TECHNIQUES USED IN THIS PATTERN:

- Chain and double crochet stitch.
- Slip stitch.
- Working Corner to Corner.

PATTERN NOTES

This blanket is worked flat from the lower right corner to the upper left corner, first increasing to the desired length, then working even and finally decreasing to form a form a rectangle. The color changes in Fable® make this blanket a true piece of art!

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BABY BLANKET

Increase Section

Ch 6.

Row 1: Dc in 4th ch from hk, dc in next 2 ch, turn – 1 block.

Row 2: Ch 6, dc in 4th ch from hk, dc in next 2 ch, (sl st, ch 3, 3 dc) in ch-3 sp of first block, turn -2 blocks.

Row 3: Ch 6, dc in 4th ch from hk, dc in next 2 ch, *(sl st, ch 3, 3 dc) in ch-3 sp of next block; rep from * to end, turn – 1 block inc'd, 3 blocks.

Rows 4-23: Rep Row 3 – 23 blocks at the end of Row 23.

EVEN SECTION

Row 1: Ch 6, dc in 4th ch from hk, dc in next 2 ch, *(sl st, ch 3, 3 dc) in ch-3 sp of next block; rep from * to last block, sl st in ch-3 sp of last block, turn.

Row 2: SI st in first 3 dc, *(sI st, ch 3, 3 dc) in ch-3 sp of next block; rep from * to end.

Rep these 2 rows, 1 more time.

DECREASE SECTION

Row 1: *(SI st, ch 3, 3 dc) in ch-3 space of next block; rep from * to last block, sI st in ch-3 sp of last block, turn — 1 block dec'd, 22 blocks rem. Rep Row 1 until one block remains. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends. Block to finished measurements.
