

Ginko Leaf Tank

SIZES

Small (Medium, Large) Shown in Small Size

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Length: 22 (22½, 23½)" Bust: 33½ (36¼, 39)"

MATERIALS

Premier® Yarns Cotton Soft Silk Multi (78% cotton, 22% silk; 70gm/126 yds)

• #955-02 Azalea Hill – 5 (5, 6) balls **Hook:** US Size I-9 (5.5 mm) *or size needed to obtain gauge*

Notions: Tapestry needle

GAUGE

4 shells x 6 rows = 4"

Save time, check your gauge.

STITCH GUIDE

Shell (sh): (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in same sp

Ginko Leaf Edging

Row 1: Ch 5, (1 tr, ch 3, 1 tr) in 5th ch from hook, turn.

Row 2: Ch 3, skip 1st tr, 9 dc in ch 3 sp, skip 1 tr, (1 tr, ch 3, 1 tr) under 4 ch at beg of row 1, turn.

Row 3: Ch 3, skip 1st tr, 9 dc in ch 3 sp, skip 1 tr, (1 tr, ch 3. 1 tr) in sp bef next dc, turn. Repeat Row 3 to desired length, completing an even number of rows. Do not turn.

Header Row: Ch 9, 1 sc in 3rd ch of beg ch 3 of last shell completed, *ch 6, 1 sc in 3rd ch at beg of next shell along this edge; rep from * to end. Fasten off.

Picot: Ch 3, sl st in 3rd ch from hook.

TANK

Lower Edging

Work Ginko Leaf Edging until you have 36 (40, 44) leaves. Work Header Row. Join with a sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch 9 of Header Row.

Top

Rnd 1: Working into Header Row and beg at join, ch 3 (counts as dc throughout), dc, ch 2, 2 dc (beg-sh made), work 27 (29, 31) more shells evenly around Header Row, sl st in 3^{rd} ch of beg ch-3 to join -28 (30, 32) sh.

Rnd 2: SI st to 1st ch-2 sp, ch 3, dc in same sp, sh in each sh around, 2 dc in beg-sh, hdc in 3rd ch of beg ch-3 to join.

Rnd 3: SI st in sp formed by joining hdc, ch 3, dc in same sp, sh in each sh around, 2 dc in beg-sh, hdc in 3rd ch of beg ch-3 to join. Rep Rnd 3, 17 (19, 21) more times.

Front

Armhole

Row 1: SI st across 2 (2, 3) sh, (ch 3, dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in next ch-2 sp, work across 11 (11, 12) sh, and turn.

Row 2: SI st to 1st ch-2 sp, (ch 3, dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in same sp, sh in each sh across, turn. Repeat Row 2, 6 (6, 7) more times. Fasten off.

Back

Armhole

Row 1: Leaving 2 (2, 3) sh unworked, join yarn to ch-2 sp, (ch 3, dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in same space, sh across next 11 (11, 12) sh.

Row 2: SI st to 1st ch-2 sp, (ch 3, dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in same sp, sh in each sh across, turn. Repeat Row 2, 6 (6, 7) more times. Fasten off.

Armhole Edging

Attach yarn to upper edge of armhole on RS.

Row 1: Sc in top of sh, ch 3 around armhole edge, turn.

Row 2: (Sc, ch 2, sc) in each ch-3 sp from previous row. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Armhole Edging

Attach yarn to upper edge of armhole on RS.

Row 1: Sc in top of sh, ch 3 around armhole edge, turn.

Row 2: (Sc, ch 2, sc) in each ch-3 sp from previous row. Fasten off.

Repeat for other armhole.

Top Edging

With RS facing, attach yarn to upper edge of top. **Row 1:** (Ch 3, picot, ch 3, dc, picot) in 1st ch-2 sp, (ch 3, dc, picot) between next two sh, *(dc, picot) in next ch-2 sp, (dc, picot) between next two sh; repeat from * to last ch-2 sp. Fasten off. Repeat for other side.

Twisted Tie

Cut 2, 2 yd lengths of yarn and fold in half. Place a pencil or dowel in loop formed where yarn is folded. Attach other end to a drawer pull or other stationary object. Twist tie until full length of tie is tightly wound. Holding both ends, release from drawer pull and pencil and allow tie to twist back on itself. Thread completed tie through upper eyelets of front and back. Tie ends on shoulders to form straps.
