



Headwrap and Cowl

SIZES

One Size

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Headwrap

Circumference: 21"; will stretch to fit a range of sizes.

Height: 5"

Cowl

Circumference: 26"

Height: 13"

MATERIALS

Premier® Yarns Serenity® Chunky Tweed (97% Acrylic, 3% Viscose; 3.5oz/100g, 109yds/100m)

- 900-15 Light Blue with Natural Flecks – 2 balls

Hook: US Size M-13 (9 mm) *or size needed to obtain gauge*

Notions: Tapestry needle

GAUGE

Headwrap: 10 sts x 8 rows = 4" in pattern

Cowl: 9 sts x 8 rows = 4" in pattern

Save time, check your gauge.

Skills/techniques used in this pattern:

- Chain and half double crochet stitches.
- Working in the back loop only.
- Seaming.

PATTERN NOTES

The Cowl is worked in 2 sections and then sewn together on one edge to join. Stitches for the second section are picked up from the first section. The Headwrap is worked in one piece

and sewn together to make a ring.

COWL

First Section

Ch 30.

Row 1 (RS): Hdc in 2nd ch from hk and in each ch across, turn – 29 hdc.

Row 2: Ch 1, working in blo, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, hdc in each st across, turn.

Rows 4-35: Rep Rows 2-3. Do not fasten off.

Second Section

Row 1: Ch 1, working across ends of rows as sts, hdc in next 35 sts, turn – 35 sc.

Row 2: Ch 1, working in the blo, hdc in each st across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, hdc in each st across, turn.

Rows 4-35: Rep Rows 2-3.

Fasten off leaving a long tail for sewing.

FINISHING

Sew ends of pieces together to make a ring. Weave in ends.

HEADWRAP

Ch 48.

Row 1: Hdc in 2nd ch from hk and in each ch across, turn.

Row 2 (RS): Ch 1, working in blo, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, hdc in each st across, turn.

Rows 4-11: Rep Rows 2-3.

Fasten off leaving a long tail for sewing.

FINISHING

Sew ends of pieces together to make a ring. Weave in ends.
