Plum Baby Blanket

## FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Length: 34" Height: 28"

## **MATERIALS**

**Premier® Yarns** *Sweet Roll® Fruits* (100% Acrylic; 3.5oz/100g, 174yds/160m)

• 2056-03 Plum – 4 cakes

**Hook:** US Size H-8 (5 mm) Tunisian crochet hook *or size needed to obtain gauge* 

**Notions:** Tapestry needle

## **GAUGE**

14 sts x 11 rows = 4" in stitch pattern **Save time, check your gauge.**

## STITCH GUIDE

# **Tunisian Simple Stitch (Tss)**

A Tunisian crochet row consists of two passes, a Forward Pass to pick up the bars and hold all of them on the hook at once, and a Reverse Pass to work the bars off the hook one at a time and complete the stitches.

Reverse Pass: Ch 1, \*Yo and pull through 2 loops on hook; repeat from \* until all but 1 loop are off the hook.

**Forward Pass:** Pick up the vertical bars created on the Reverse Pass and leave them all on the hook. Be sure to catch the final bar at the end of the pass.

## **BLANKET**

Ch 90.

**Set-up Row:** Working in the back bumps of the ch and starting in the 2nd ch from hook, pick up 1 loop for each ch across, leaving loops hook — 90 loops on hook.

Work 88 rows of Tunisian Simple Stitch — 90

Tss.

**Last Row:** Work 1 row of sc sts across to fill in holes created by the last **Reverse Pass** — 90 sc.

## **FINISHING**

# Border

Rnd 1: Ch 1, sc into each stitch around the other 3 sides of the blanket, working (sc, ch 1, sc) in each corner, join with a sl st to first sc.
Rnd 2: Ch 2, \*sk next sc, sc in next sc, ch 1; rep from \* around, working (sc, ch 1, sc) in each ch-1 corner sp, sl st to first ch-2 sp to join.
Rnds 3-5: Ch 2, \*sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, sk next sc; rep from \* around, working (sc, ch 1, sc) in each ch-1 corner sp, sl st to first ch-2 sp to join.

## **ABBREVIATIONS**

Fasten off. Weave in all ends.
