# Pretty in Tweed Sweater



**TYPE:** Knit

**DESIGNER:** Tori Gurbisz for Premier® Yarns

## SIZES

XS (S, M, L, 1X) (2X, 3X, 4X, 5X)

Shown in S size.

## FINISHED MEASUREMENTS:

**Chest:** 37¾ (42¼, 45¾, 50¼, 53¾)  
(58¼, 61¾, 66¼, 69¾)''

**Length:** 22¼ (22½, 23¼, 23¾, 24¼)  
(24½, 24¾, 24¾, 25½)''

## GAUGE:

22 sts x 28 rows = 4'' in St st with larger  
needle

**Save time, check your gauge.**

## MATERIALS:

**Premier® Yarns Anti-Pilling Everyday®**  
**DK** (100% Anti-Pilling Acrylic;  
3.5oz/100g, 273yds/250m)

- MC: 1107-55 Blush – 6 (6, 7, 8, 8) (9, 10, 10, 11) balls

**Premier® Yarns Trinket™** (75% Acrylic,  
20% Nylon; 1.76oz/50g, 437yds/400m)

- CC: 2161-09 Obsidian – 4 (4, 5, 5, 5) (6, 7, 7, 7) balls

## NEEDLES & NOTIONS:

- **US Size 6 (4mm) and US Size 5 (3.75 mm) straight**
- **Tapestry needle, stitch holder or waste yarn, locking stitch markers**



## SKILLS/TECHNIQUES USED IN THIS PATTERN:

- Knit and purl stitches.
- K2tog and ssk decreases.
- Kfb increases.
- Placing stitches on hold.
- Seaming with mattress stitch and whipstitch.
- Picking up and knitting stitches.
- Working with 2 yarns held together.
- Changing colors.

### **1x1 Rib** (*multiple of 2 sts*)

**Row 1:** \*K1, p1; rep from \* to end.

Rep Row 1 for patt.

### **Stripe Pattern** (*any number of sts*)

12 rows MC.

12 rows MC and CC held together.

Rep these 24 rows for patt.

## PATTERN NOTES

This Pullover is worked from the bottom up in pieces and seamed. It features tweedy stripes and a polished fold over neckband. Cut CC between stripes.

## SWEATER

### **BACK**

With smaller needles and MC, cast on 106 (118, 128, 140, 150) (162, 172, 184, 194) sts.

Work even in **1x1 Rib** until piece meas 3”.

Switch to larger needles. Work even in St st and **Stripe Patt** (starting with MC rows) until piece meas 22¼ (22½, 23¼, 23¾, 24¼) (24½, 24¾, 24¾, 25½)” from cast-on edge. Bind off all sts.

### **FRONT**

Work as for Back until piece meas 20 (20¼, 20¾, 21¼, 21¾) (22, 22, 22, 22½)” from cast-on edge. End having just worked a WS row.

### **NECK SHAPING**

*Note: Maintain **Stripe Patt** throughout this section.*

**Row 1 (RS):** K39 (45, 50, 55, 60) (66, 71, 77, 82) (left shoulder sts), bind off 28 (28, 28, 30, 30) (30, 30, 30, 30) sts, knit across rem 39 (45, 50, 55, 60)

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(66, 71, 77, 82) (right shoulder sts), place left shoulder sts on stitch holder or waste yarn.

**Row 2 (WS):** Work even in est'd patt.

**Dec Row (RS):** K1, ssk, work in patt to end — 1 st dec'd.

**Even Row:** Work even in est'd patt.

Rep last 2 rows 4 (4, 4, 5, 5) (5, 6, 6, 6) more times — 4 (4, 4, 5, 5) (5, 6, 6, 6) sts dec'd, 34 (40, 45, 49, 54) (60, 64, 70, 75) sts rem.

Work even in patt until piece meas 22¼ (22½, 23¼, 23¾, 24¼) (24½, 24¾, 24¾, 25½)" from cast-on edge. Bind off sts.

Place held sts on working needle and with WS facing, join yarn.

**Next Row (WS):** Work even in patt to end.

**Dec Row (RS):** Work in est'd patt to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1— 1 st dec'd.

**Even Row:** Work even in est'd patt.

Rep last 2 rows 4 (4, 4, 5, 5) (5, 6, 6, 6) more times — 4 (4, 4, 5, 5) (5, 6, 6, 6) sts dec'd, 34 (40, 45, 49, 54) (60, 64, 70, 75) sts rem.

Work even in patt until piece meas 22¼ (22½, 23¼, 23¾, 24¼) (24½, 24¾, 24¾, 25½)" from cast-on edge. Bind off all sts.

## SLEEVES (MAKE 2)

With smaller needles and MC, cast on 52 (54, 54, 54, 54) (58, 58, 58, 60) sts. Work even in **1x1 Rib** until piece meas 3". Switch to larger needles.

Work even in St st and **Stripe Patt** (starting with MC rows) for 2 rows.

## SLEEVE SHAPING

*Note: Maintain Stripe Patt throughout this section.*

**Inc Row (RS):** K1, kfb, work even in patt to last 2 sts, kfb, k1 — 2 sts inc'd.

**All other rows:** Work even in est'd patt.

Rep Inc Row every RS row 0 (0, 0, 5, 11) (11, 13, 13, 19) more times, every other RS row 16 (19, 28, 26, 23) (23, 22, 22, 19) times, and then every 6th row 8 (6, 0, 0, 0) (0, 0, 0, 0) times — 48 (50, 56, 62, 68) (68, 70, 70, 76) sts inc'd, 102 (106, 112, 118, 124) (128, 130, 130, 138) sts. Work even in patt until Sleeve meas 21" from cast-on edge, bind off sts.

## FINISHING

Wash and block Front, Back and Sleeves, if desired.

Sew one shoulder seam using mattress st, use MC for all seams.

## NECK EDGING

With smaller needles, MC and RS facing, pick up and knit 88 (88, 88, 96, 96) (96, 102, 102, 102) sts along neck opening. Work even in **1x1 Rib** until rib

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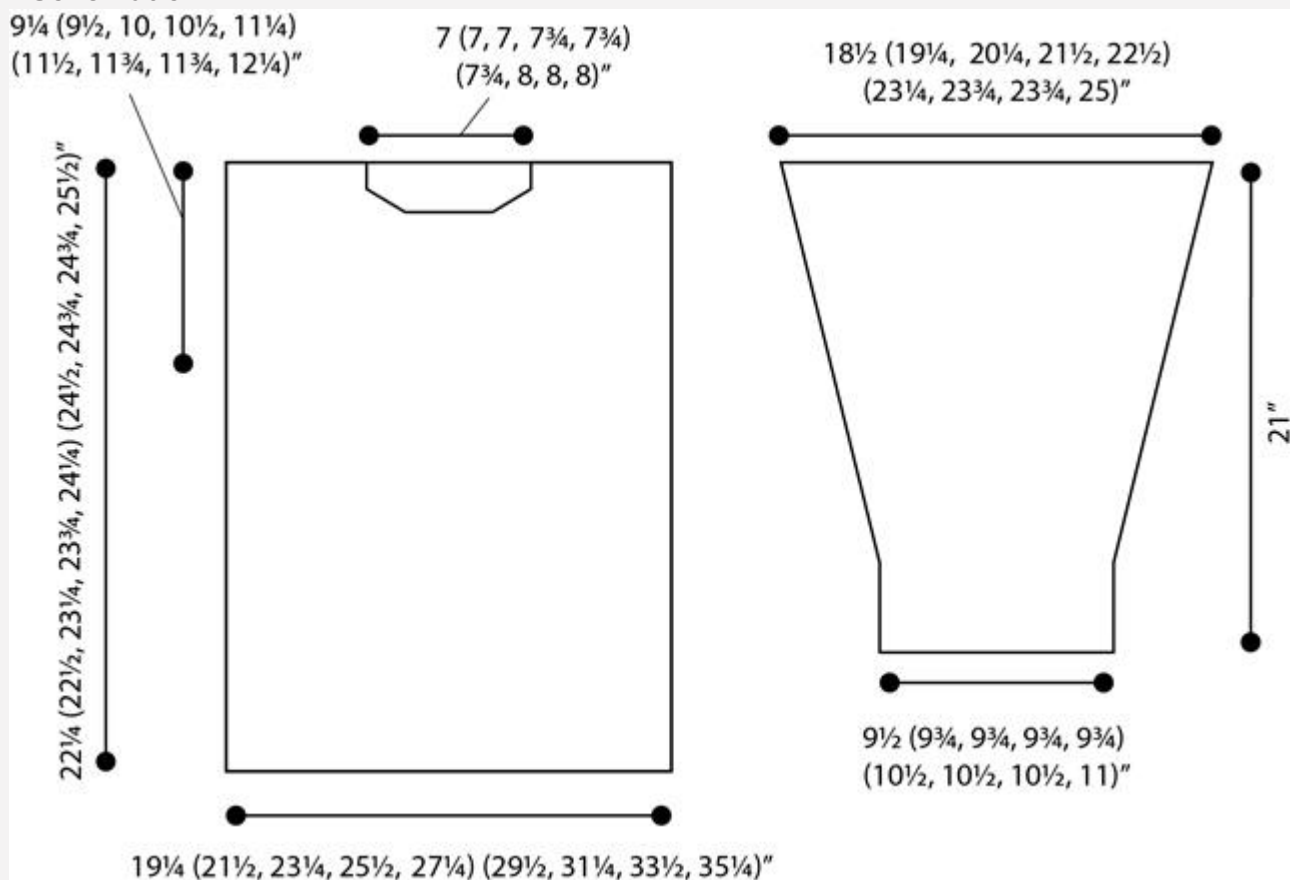
meas 3½". Loosely bind off all sts in rib.

Sew other shoulder seam and Neck Edging. Turn Pullover inside out, fold Neck Edging with WS together and whipstitch bind-off edge to the seam where the sts were picked up.

Place locking marker at the top center of each Sleeve. Use marker to align center of Sleeve with shoulder seam, sew Sleeves along the edge of Front and Back. Seam the Sleeves and then the Front and Back.

Weave in ends.

| <b>kfb</b>     | knit into the front and back of the next st (1 st inc'd) |
| <b>k2tog</b>   | knit 2 sts together (1 st dec'd)                         |
| <b>MC</b>      | main color   |
| <b>meas</b>    | measures   |
| <b>p</b>       | purl   |
| <b>patt</b>    | pattern  |
| <b>rem</b>     | remain(ing)  |
| <b>rep</b>     | repeat(ing)  |
| <b>RS</b>      | right side   |
