Double Striped Cowl

Level: Intermediate

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Length: 12"

Circumference: 19"

MATERIALS

Premier® Yarns Luna (100% Anti-Pilling Acrylic; 3.5oz/100g, 273yds/250m)

- #1072- 02 Saturn – 1 ball (A)

Premier® Yarns DK Colors (100% Anti-Pilling Acrylic; 5oz/140g, 383yds/350m)

- #1071-17 Tulip – 1 ball (B)

Needle: US Size 6 (4 mm) 16" circular needle *or size needed to obtain gauge*

Notions: Tapestry needle, stitch marker

GAUGE

22 sts x 24 rows = 4" in **Striped Colorwork Patt**
Save time, check your gauge.

STITCH GUIDE

Striped Colorwork Pattern (*multiple of 2 sts*)

Rnd 1: *With Yarn A k2, with Yarn B k2*; rep from * to end of round. Sm.

Rep Rnd 1 for patt.

Striped Ribbed Pattern (*multiple of 2 sts*)

Rnd 1: *With B k2, with A p2*; rep from * to end of round. Sm.

Rep Rnd 1 for patt.

PATTERN NOTES

This cowl uses two different striping yarns to create a unique colorworked garment.

Make sure not to cut either yarn unless told to do so in the pattern, because both yarns will be used simultaneously.

COWL

With A, cast on 108 sts.

Pm for beginning of round and join to work in the round, being careful not to twist.

Beginning with B, work the **Striped Ribbed Pattern** for 9 rnds.

Work **Striped Colorwork Pattern** until cowl measures 10.5" from cast on edge. Cut B, leaving a tail for weaving in later.

Using **only A** Work **Striped Rib Pattern** for 9 rnds.

BO all sts in patt.

FINISHING

Block cowl to finished measurements. Weave in ends.

Henley Sweater

Level: Intermediate

SIZES

Extra Small (Small, Medium, Large, Extra Large, 2X)

Shown in Small Size

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Finished Bust Size: 40 (44, 49, 53, 58, 62)''

Length: 22 (22, 23, 23, 24, 24)''

MATERIALS

Premier® Yarns Everyday® Soft Worsted (100% Anti-Pilling Acrylic; 4oz/118g, 203yds/186m)

- #ED100-57 Mouse Gray – 4 (4, 5, 6, 7, 8) balls (MC)
- #ED100-47 Twilight Blue – 1 ball (CC)

Needles: US Size 8 (5 mm) 24'' and US Size 6 (4 mm) 16'' circular needle *or size needed to obtain gauge*

Notions: Tapestry needle, 2 stitch markers

GAUGE

16 sts x 24 rows = 4'' in St st

16 sts x 24 rows = 4'' in Moss St

Save time, check your gauge.

STITCH GUIDE

Stockinette Stitch (*any multiple of sts*)

Row 1 (RS): Knit.

Row 2 (WS): Purl.

Rep rows 1-2 for patt.

Moss Stitch (*multiple of 2 sts*)

Row 1 (RS): *K1, p1*; repeat from * to end of row.

Row 2: Repeat Row 1.

Row 3: *P1, k1*; repeat from * to end of row.

Row 4: Repeat Row 3.

Rep rows 1-4 for patt.

Neck Decrease Row (RS): First half, knit to 3 sts before the neck edge, k2tog, k1; second half, k1, ssk, work to the end of the row.

Neck Decrease Row (WS): First half, purl to 3 sts before the neck edge, p2tog, p1; second half, p1, ssp, work to the end of the row.

PATTERN NOTES

The pattern is written for the smallest size, with larger sizes in parenthesis. If only one number is given, it applies to all sizes.

BACK

With MC cast on 82 (90, 100, 108, 118, 126) sts. Work in **Moss Stitch** for 2''. Work even in **St st** until piece measures 21 ½ (21 ½, 22 ½, 22 ½, 23 ½, 23 ½)'' from cast on edge, ending with a WS row.

Next Row (RS): K27 (31, 36, 40, 45, 49) sts, join a second ball of yarn and bind off center 28 sts, knit to end. Working both sides separately at the same time, work next WS row in purl, then bind off in knit on next row.

Henley Sweater

FRONT

Work as for back until piece measures 14 (14, 15, 15, 16, 16)'' from cast on edge, ending on a WS row. Place markers on both sides of the middle 4 sts.

Next Row (RS): Knit across to the first marker, join a second ball of yarn, and bind off the middle 4 sts between markers, then, knit across to the end of the row.

Working both sides separately at the same time, knit even in **St st** for 5½'', ending with a WS row.

Shape the Neck

Continuing to work both sides separately. At the same time, bind off at each neck edge:

4 sts once, 3 sts once, then 2 sts once. Work

Neck Decreases for the RS and WS rows at each neck edge for the next 3 rows.

You will have 27 (31, 36, 40, 45, 49) sts remaining on each side.

Work even until front measures same as back. Then BO and sew shoulder seams.

SLEEVES

Measure down 6 ¾ (6 ¾, 7 ¼, 7 ¾, 8 ½, 9)'' from the top of the shoulder seam on both the front and back pieces, place marker on front and back where you have measured down. With RS facing and MC, pick up and knit 54 (54, 58, 64, 68, 72) sts between markers for sleeve. Work in **St st** until sleeve measures 9½ (9½, 10½, 10½, 11½, 11½)'' ending on a RS row. Change to CC and work in **Moss Stitch** for three rows.

Next Row (RS) (Sleeve Dec Row): k2tog/p2tog, work in **Moss Stitch** until last 2 sts, ssk/ssp.

NOTE: To know whether you should knit or purl the decrease you must look at the 3rd st from the beginning or 3rd stitch from the end...

If the 3rd st from the beginning is knit then p2tog.
If the 3rd st from the beginning is purl then k2tog.
If the 3rd st from the end is purl then ssk.
If the 3rd st from the end is knit then ssp.

This will ensure that the **Moss Stitch** pattern is continuous even as you decrease the sleeve.

Continue in **Moss Stitch** and decrease the sleeve every other RS row 12 (12, 11, 11, 10, 10) times. 30 (30, 36, 42, 48, 52) sts.

****For size Extra Small and Small ONLY****

Work even in **Moss Stitch** for two rows then BO in pattern all sts.

**** For size Medium and Large Only****

Work even in **Moss Stitch** for 3 rows then BO in pattern all sts.

****For Size Extra Large and 2X Large****

Work even in **Moss Stitch** for 1 row then BO in pattern all sts.

FINISHING

Sew side and sleeve seams.

Neck Trim

With RS facing and a smaller 16'' circular needle, begin at left neck edge front. Using CC, pick up and knit 52 sts around neck opening. Do not join in the round. Work in **Moss Stitch** for 6 rows. Bind off loosely in pattern.

Placket

With RS facing and a smaller 16'' circular needle, begin at the top of the placket opening on the left front. Using CC pick up and knit 24 sts along the side of the neckband, continuing down the placket opening. Work in **Moss Stitch** for 6 rows, bind off loosely in pattern. Repeat process on right front. Overlap the right front placket over the left front placket and sew them together at their lower edges.

Weave in ends. Block to finished measurements.

Level: Intermediate

SIZES

Extra Small (Small, Medium, Large, Extra Large, 2X)

Shown in Extra Small Size

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Bust Circumference: 35 (39, 43, 47, 51, 53)''

Length: 22 (22, 23, 23, 24, 24)''

MATERIALS

Premier® Yarns *Everyday® Soft Worsted* (100% anti-pilling acrylic; 4oz/113g, 203yds/186m)

- #ED100-57 Mouse Gray – 2 (2, 3, 3, 4, 4) balls (MC)
- #ED100-22 Bittersweet – 1 (1, 2, 2, 3, 3) balls (CC)

Needle: US Size 8 (5 mm) 32'' circular needle *size needed to obtain gauge*

Notions: Tapestry needle, stitch markers, 4 stitch holders

GAUGE

16 sts x 20 rows = 4'' in St st

Save time, check your gauge.

STITCH GUIDE

Seersucker Stitch (*multiple of 4 sts*)

Row 1 (RS): *K1, p1*; rep from * across all sts.

Row 2: *K1, p1*; rep from * across all sts.

Row 3: *P1, k3*; rep from * across all sts.

Row 4: *P3, k1*; rep from * across all sts.

Row 5-6: *K1, p1*; rep from * across all sts.

Row 7: K2, *p1, k3*; rep from * to last 2 sts, p1, k1.

Row 8: P1, *k1, p3*; rep from * to last 3 sts k1, p2.

Rep Rows 1-8 for patt.

PATTERN NOTES

Shirt is knit in two identical pieces and seamed together at shoulders and sides, leaving room for armholes.

Pattern is written for the smallest size, with larger sizes in parenthesis. If only one number is given, it applies to all sizes.

GARMENT

BACK

Cast on 72 (80, 88, 96, 104, 108) sts in CC. Begin working in St st (Knit RS, purl WS) for 4 rows. Then, work in Seer Sucker patt until garment measures 7¼ (7¼, 7¼, 7¼, 8, 8)'', ending with a WS row.

Break yarn and rejoin with MC.

Continue in **Seersucker Stitch** until garment measures 14½ (14½, 15½, 15½, 16, 16)'', ending with a WS row.

Shape Neck

Next Row (RS): Place marker in the center of the row. Then, k to 2 sts before center m, ssk, remove m, place the next 36 (40, 44, 48, 52, 54) sts onto a holder to be worked later. Turn and work these sts only.

Continue to work in St st, dec at neck edge by working ssk at the end of every RS row 11 (10, 11, 14, 15, 15) more times, then, work ssk at end of every other RS Row 2 (3, 3, 2, 2, 2) times. 22 (26, 29, 31, 34, 36) sts rem. Place sts onto a holder.

Seersucker Shirt

Rejoin yarn to neck edge of held sts and work as first half, k2tog at the beginning of every RS row 11 (10, 11, 14, 15, 15) more times, then, k2tog at the beginning of every other RS row 2 (3, 3, 2, 2, 2) times. 22 (26, 29, 31, 34, 36) sts rem. Place sts onto a holder.

FRONT

Work as for Back.

Join front and back together by working 3-needle BO across shoulder sts.

SLEEVES

Measure down 6 (6, 6½, 7, 8, 9)" from shoulder seam on each side of garment front and back; place markers. Using mattress st, seam the sides from bottom up until m is reached.

FINISHING

Weave in ends. Block to finished measurements..

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Bust Circumference: 29 (33, 37, 41, 45)''

Length: 26 (26 ¼, 26 ¾, 26 ¾, 27)''

MATERIALS

Premier® Yarns Everyday® Soft Worsted (100% Anti-Pilling Acrylic; 4oz/113g, 203yds/186m)

- #ED100-23 Mist – 2 (2, 3, 3, 4) balls (A)
- #ED100-57 Mouse Gray – 2 (2, 3, 3, 4) balls (B)

Needle: US Size 8 (5 mm) straight needle *or size needed to obtain gauge*

Notions: Tapestry needle, stitch markers

GAUGE

16 sts x 24 rows = 4'' in St st
Save time, check your gauge.

STITCH GUIDE

Stockinette Stitch (St st)

Row 1 (RS): Knit.

Row 2: Purl.

Rep Rows 1-2 for patt.

Decrease Row (RS): K1, ssk, knit to the last 3 sts, k2tog, k1—2 sts dec'd.

Decrease Row (WS): P1, p2tog, purl to the last 3 sts, ssp, p1—2 sts dec'd.

PATTERN NOTES

This garment uses raglan construction, all pieces of the sweater are knit flat and seamed together at the armholes. Decreases will happen on RS rows.

The pattern is written for the smallest size, with larger sizes in parenthesis. If only one number is given, it applies to all sizes.

BACK

With A, Cast on 80 (88, 96, 104, 112) sts. Knit 6 rows in **St st**.

Begin Waist Decreases

Work **Decrease Row** every 10th row 2 (1, 1, 1, 0) time(s), then every 8th row 8 (9, 9, 9, 9) times.

****For XL size only; work 1 additional Decrease Row on every 6th row. ****

All Sizes

60 (68, 76, 84, 92) sts rem. Continue in **St st** until garment measures 16½ (16, 16, 16, 15½)'' from cast on edge, ending on a WS row.

Shape the Armholes

BO 4 (4, 4, 4, 6) sts at the beg of the next 2 rows. Work the **Decrease Row** every other RS row 11 (8, 6, 2, 1) time(s), then every RS row 1 (8, 14, 22, 25) time(s).

**** For small and XL size only; work 1 row even. ****

BO all sts.

Two Toned Bellsleeve Sweater

Level: Intermediate

project continued

FRONT

Work same as Back until armhole shaping.

Neck/Armhole Shaping

Note: Read through entire section before proceeding—you will be shaping the neck at the same time as the armholes.

Begin Shaping Armholes

BO 4 (4, 4, 4, 6) sts at the beg of the next 2 rows. Work the **Decrease Row** every other RS Row 11 (8, 6, 2, 1) time(s), then every RS Row 1 (8, 14, 22, 25) time(s).

** For small and XL size only; work 1 row even. **

At the same time, when armholes measure 1¾ (2¼, 2¾, 2¾, 3¼)" from bound off sts, begin shaping neck while continuing to dec at armholes.

Begin Shaping Neck

Pm to mark the halfway point of the row.

Next row (RS) (Dec Row): Work across until 3 sts before m, k2tog, k1; join a second ball of yarn, remove m, k1, ssk and work across to end of the row.

Working both sides at once with separate balls of yarn, continue to dec 1 st at each neck edge every RS row 11 times more, then every other RS row 2 times. No sts will remain.

SLEEVES (Make 2)

With Yarn B, Cast on 56 (58, 62, 66, 70) sts. Knit 6 rows in st st.

For size Extra Small ONLY

Work **Decrease Row** every 18th row 2 times, then every 20th row 3 times more. 46 sts rem.

For sizes Small and Medium ONLY

Work **Decrease Row** every 24th row 4 times. --(50, 54, --, --) sts rem.

For size Large ONLY

Work **Decrease Row** every 24th row 3 times, then once more on the 26th row. 58 sts rem.

For size Extra Large ONLY

Work **Decrease Row** every 32nd row 2 times, then once more on the 34th row. 64 sts rem.

All Sizes

Continue even until piece measures 18 (18, 18, 18½, 18½)" from the cast on edge, ending on a WS row.

Shape the Cap

BO 4 (4, 4, 4, 6) sts at the beg of the next 2 rows. Work **Decrease Row** every other RS row 9 (8, 8, 6, 6) times, then every RS row 5 (8, 10, 14, 15) times more.

For size Small and Extra Large only; work one row even

10 (10, 10, 10, 10) sts rem.

Two Toned Bellsleeve Sweater

FINISHING

To finish, seam together the armholes of the sleeves to the armholes of the front and back pieces. Seam closed the sides of the sweater body and sleeves.

Weave in ends.

Block to finished measurements.

Twisted Rib Hat & Cowl

Level: Intermediate

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

COWL

Length: 12"

Circumference: 27 ½"

HAT

Circumference: 20"

MATERIALS

Premier® Yarns *Luna* (100% Anti-pilling Acrylic; 3.5oz/100g, 273yds/250m)

- #1072-10 Callisto – 1 ball (A)
- #1072-18 Uranus – 1 ball (B)

Needle: US Size 4 (3.5 mm) 16" circular needle, US Size 6 (4 mm) 16" circular needle *or size needed to obtain gauge*

Notions: Tapestry needle, stitch marker

GAUGE

24 sts x 32 rows = 4" in Alternating Twisted Rib Patt. on larger needles (slightly stretched)

Save time, check your gauge.

STITCH GUIDE

p1tbl: purl one stitch through the back loop

k1tbl: knit 1 stitch through the back loop

Alternating Twisted Rib (*multiple of 2 sts in the round*)

Rnds 1-7: With B, *k1tbl, p1tbl*; rep from * to end of round.

Rnds 8-14: With A, *p1tbl, k1tbl*; rep from * to end of round.

Rep Rnds 1-14 for patt.

K3, P3 Ribbing (*multiple of 6 sts in the round*)

Rnd 1: *K3, p3*; rep from * to end of round.

Rep rnd 1 for patt.

PATTERN NOTES

Hat and cowl are both knit in the round with alternating variegated yarn.

There is no need to cut the non-working yarn. Instead, carry the non-working yarn up the inside of the work loosely, twisting the strands together every couple rounds.

COWL

Using larger needle and A, cast on 110 sts. Pm for beginning of round and join to work in the round, being careful not to twist cast on. Work in St st for 4 rnds. With B, work **Alternating Twisted Rib** Rnds 1-14, 6 times total (84 rnds). Making sure to switch yarn every 7 rnds. Then, with B, knit 3 rnds and bind off all sts loosely.

HAT

With A and smaller needles, cast on 120 sts. Pm and join to work in the round, being careful not to twist. Work **K3, P3 Ribbing** until piece measures 3" from cast on edge. Change to larger needles. With B, work **Alternating Twisted Rib**, Rnds 1-14 4 times total, (56 rnds), making sure to switch yarn every 7 rnds. Cut B, leaving a tail for weaving in later. Then, switch to A to begin shaping crown in St st.

Twisted Rib Hat & Cowl

Shape Crown

Note: Change to dpns when stitches will no longer fit comfortably on circular needles.

Rnd 1: *K10, k2tog*; rep from * to end – 110 sts.

Rnd 2: Knit.

Rnd 3: *K9, k2tog*; rep from * to end – 100 sts.

Rnd 4: Knit.

Rnd 5: *K8, k2tog*; rep from * to end – 90 sts.

Rnd 6: Knit.

Rnd 7: *K7, k2tog*; rep from * to end – 80 sts.

Rnd 8: Knit.

Rnd 9: *K6, k2tog*; rep from * to end – 70 sts.

Rnd 10: Knit.

Rnd 11: *K5, k2tog*; rep from * to end – 60 sts.

Rnd 12: Knit.

Rnd 13: *K4, k2tog*; rep from * to end – 50 sts.

Rnd 14: Knit.

Rnd 15: *K3, k2tog*; rep from * to end – 40 sts.

Rnd 16: Knit.

Rnd 17: *K2, k2tog*; rep from * to end – 30 sts.

Rnd 18: Knit.

Rnd 19: *K1, k2tog*; rep from * to end – 20 sts.

Rnd 20: k2tog 10 times – 10 sts.

Break yarn. Using a tapestry needle, draw tail through rem sts and pull tight to close top of hat.

Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.

Gently block to finished measurements.

Basket Weave Mod Tote

Level: Intermediate

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Width: 7 ½"

Length: 18 ½"

Height: 12"

MATERIALS

Premier® Yarns Everyday® Bulky (100% Anti-pilling Acrylic; 3.5oz/100g, 87yds/80m)

- #1068-05 Black – 2 balls (A)
- #1068-15 Aqua – 1 ball (B)
- #1068-02 Linen – 3 balls (C)

Hooks: US Size K/10.5 (6.5 mm) crochet hook, US Size J/10 (6 mm) crochet hook, and US Size H/8 (5 mm) crochet hook, *or size needed to obtain gauge*

Notions: Tapestry needle, pompom maker, tassel maker

GAUGE

12 sts x 8 rows = 4" in Basket Weave with 6.5 mm hook

12 sts x 14 rows = 4" in Single crochet with 6 mm hook

Save time, check your gauge.

PATTERN NOTES

You will begin building the tote by crocheting the bottom, then each side panel (4) and attaching to each side of the tote bottom. Then you will sew the sides of the panels together to form the tote.

STITCH GUIDE

Fpdc (front post double crochet): Yo, insert hk from front to back to front around the post of the st and draw yarn through, yo and draw through 2 loops on hk, yo and draw through 2 loops on hk.

Bpdc (back post double crochet): Yo, insert hook from back to front to back around the post of st and draw yarn through, yo and draw through 2 loops on hk, yo and draw through 2 loops on hk.

Mesh stitch: *Ch 1, sk a st, dc next st*; rep from * to end.

Note: When you are crocheting a mesh stitch over another row of mesh stitch, dc into the open mesh space instead of into a st.

TOTE BOTTOM

With medium size (6 mm) crochet hk and A, Ch 46.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hk, sc in each ch across, turn – 45 sc.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn. Rep Row 2, 16 more times. Cut A.

Rnd 19: With B, turn bottom to work along long edge, sc in each st across side (45 sc), ch 1, sc in each st across next side (17 sc), ch 1, sc in each st across next side (45 sc), ch 1, sc in each stitch across next side (17 sc), sl st in 1st sc to join. You should have 127 sts – 124 sc + 3 ch sp.

Basket Weave Mod Tote

SHORT SIDE PANEL (Make 2)

With larger (6.5 mm) crochet hk and B, sl st into the last st on the short side of tote bottom ready to work a WS Row.

Row 1 (WS): Ch 2, dc in each st across (16 dc), dc 1 in chain sp, turn.

Row 2 (RS): Ch 2 (counts as dc here and throughout), *fpdc around each of the next 4 dc, bpdC around each of the next 4 dc, rep from * once more, hdc into last ch sp, turn.

Row 3: Rep Row 2.

Row 4: Ch 2, *bpdC around each next 4 dc, fpdc around each next 4 dc*; rep from * once more, hdc into last ch sp, turn.

Row 5: Rep Row 4.

Rows 6-7: Rep Row 2.

Rows 8-9: Rep Row 4.

Rep Rows 6-7 and Rows 8-9 2 more times (8 more rows). Repeat this again on the other short side panel of tote.

LONG SIDE PANEL (Make 2)

With larger (6.5 mm) crochet hk and B, sl st into the last st on the long side of tote bottom, ready to work a WS Row.

Row 1 (WS): Ch 2, dc in each st across, turn. (45 dc)
Cut B. Attach C.

Row 2 (RS): Ch 2, *fpdc around each next 4 dc, bpdC around each next 4 dc*; rep from * across row, ending with 4 fpdc, turn.

Row 3: Ch 2, bpdC around each next 4 dc, fpdc around each next 4 dc, *ch 1, sk a st, dc into next st*; rep from * 3 more times to create a mesh. bpdC around next 4 dc, mesh st in next 4 sts, bpdC around next 4 dc, mesh st in next 8 stitches, fpdc around next 4 dc, bpdC around next 4 dc, hdc into last ch sp, turn.

Row 4: Ch 2, bpdC around next 4 dc, fpdc around next 4 dc, mesh st next 4 spaces (into the gaps from previous mesh stitches), bpdC around each next 4 dc, mesh st in next 2 spaces, bpdC around next 4 dc, mesh st next 4 spaces, fpdc around each next dc, bpdC around next 4 dc, hdc last ch sp, turn.

Row 5: Ch 2, fpdc around next 4 dc, bpdC around next 4 dc, mesh st in next 4 spaces, fpdc around next 4 dc, mesh st in next 2 spaces, fpdc around next 4 dc, mesh st in next 4 spaces, bpdC around next 4 dc, fpdc around next 4 dc, hdc into last chain st, turn.

Row 6: Repeat Row 5.

Row 7-8: Repeat Row 4.

Row 9-10: Repeat Row 5.

Row 11-12: Repeat Row 4.

Row 13-14: Repeat Row 5.

Row 15-16: Repeat Row 4.

Row 17-18: Repeat Row 5.

Rep these steps once more on the other long side panel of tote.

Once all the sides of the bag are complete, sew sides together to form the tote bag's shape.

TOP EDGING

With medium size (6 mm) crochet hk and A, sl st into the top edge of the tote.

Work in sc in rounds along the top edge of the tote as follows: 3 rnds A, 2 rnds C, 1 rnd B.

Cut yarn and fasten off.

HANDLES

With smaller (5 mm) crochet hk and A, Ch 100.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hk, sc in each ch across, turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn. Rep Row 2 4 more times.

Sew long edges together to create a tube which will form the handle. Skip the first 6 stitches on each end to keep those areas flat in order to sew to the inside of the bag.

FINISHING

Sew handles to the inside of the bag and weave in ends.

LOOPED TASSEL

With B and using instructions provided by tassel maker, make a tassel approx. 7" long, using A to wrap the top of the tassel (use photo as a guide). For the unique looped tassel, don't trim the ends. With A, attach to the tote handle by simply tying it on.

GAUGE

12 sts x 5 rows = 4" in Dc st

Save time, check your gauge.**STITCH GUIDE**

DC Cluster: *3 dc in indicated st, ch 1, (cluster made) sk next st*; rep from* to end.

PATTERN NOTES

Your work may not lay completely flat but do not worry, it will come together perfectly at the end when you fold the corners in to the center to form the clutch.

CLUTCH

With A, ch 4, sl st into first ch to join.

Rnd 1: *(Yo then insert hk in to center sp and draw through) twice, yo, pull through all 5 loops (cluster made), ch 2*; rep from * 4 more times. Sl st into first st to join. Cut A – 5 clusters and 5 ch-2 spaces.

Rnd 2: With B, sl st into lp on hk to join. Sc around entire rnd working 3 sc in each ch-2 sp and 1 sc in each st. Sl st with first sc to join. Cut B. – 20 sc total.

Rnd 3: With C, sl st into lp on hk to join. Ch 3 (counts as 1 dc now and throughout) and work 1 dc in same sc, work 2 dc in sc and each sc around, sl st into the top of the first dc. Cut C – 40 dc.

Rnd 4: With D, sl st into the lp on hk to join. Ch 3, 2 dc in same st (cluster made). Make 4 more **DC Clusters**, *ch 2 (corner made), 5 **DC Clusters***; rep from * twice more. Ch 2 (corner made), sl st into the top of the ch-3 to join. Cut D – 20 DC Clusters and 4 ch-2 sps and 16 ch-1 sps.

Rnd 5: With B, sl st into ch-3 corner, (ch 2, 2 dc ch-3, ch 3, 3 dc) all each corner. Work 3 dc in each ch-1 sp, while working a ch 1 between each cluster. Work (3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) into each corner. Sl st into the top of the ch-3 to join. Cut B– 24 DC Clusters and 4 ch-3 sps and 20 ch-1 sps.

Rnd 6: With A, slip st into ch-3 corner, ch 3, 2 dc in the same ch-3 sp. In the next 5 spaces, work 3 dc with a ch 1 in between each cluster. 3 dc in ch-3 space, ch 1, Cut A. Rep on opposite side of granny square to create a rectangular shape.

Rnd 7: With D, slip st into dc st (on shorter side along row of A), ch 2 and 2 hdc in same dc, 3 dc (cluster) in each ch-1 space while working a ch 1 in between each cluster. (3 hdc, ch 3, 3 hdc) in each corner. Slip st in top of ch to join. Cut D – 26 **Dc Cluster** and 8 hdc and 4 ch-3 sp and 29 ch-1 sps.

Row 8: With C, slip st into ch sp, ch 2, working along the longer side (the side that does not have the row of A) make 1 dc in each dc across. 1 dc in the ch-3 sp. Ch 1 and cut C. Rep the same steps on opposite side.

Rnd 9: With B, sl st into corner, ch 3 (this will be your button loop), 2 hdc into same sp, hdc in each dc around, working each corner as (2 hdc, ch 2, 2 hdc) in same sp. Work last corner as 2 hdc in same sp, sl st into beg ch 2.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.

Using the shape of the the finished piece as a guide, cut your fabric to match the shape, leaving about .5" of space around. Sew your fabric onto the WS of the granny square for lining.

Fold 3 corners of the square in to the center and using B, sew those edges together.

Using the photo as a guide, sew your button to the center where the 3 corners meet that you have just sewn together.

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Width: 9 ½"

Length: 9 ½" (excluding straps)

MATERIALS

Premier® Yarns *Everyday® Bulky* (100% Anti-pilling Acrylic; 3.5oz/100g, 87yds/80m)

- #1068-09 Magenta – 1 ball (A)
- #1068-02 Linen – 1 ball (B)
- #1068-12 Sky Blue – 2 balls (C)
- #1068-13 Royal Blue – 1 ball (D)

Hooks: US Size I-9 (5.5 mm) crochet hook and US Size G-6 (4 mm) *or size needed to obtain gauge*

Notions: Tapestry needle

GAUGE

12 sts x 13 rows = 4" in Sc with 5.5 mm hk

Save time, check your gauge.

STITCH GUIDE

Puff Stitch: Yo, insert hk into the designated st, yo, draw through and pull up a lp, rep twice more into the same st, (7 loops on hk), yo, pull through all 7 loops, ch 1 to complete puff st.

Cluster Stitch: Yo, insert hk into designated st or sp, yo, draw up a lp, yo, pull through 2 loops, *yo, insert hk in sp, yo, pull up a lp, yo, pull through 2 loops, rep from * twice more, (5 loops on hk), yo, pull through all 5 loops, ch 2 to complete cluster st.

PATTERN NOTES

You can save some time on weaving ends in by starting each round 2 stitches behind the stitch with the yarn tail from the previous round so you can crochet over the yarn tail to hide it as you work the round.

MANDALAS (Make 2)

With larger (5.5mm) hk and A, ch 5.

Rnd 1: Sl st to join with 1st ch, ch 3 (this counts as your first dc), make 16 dc in center of ring, sl st into the top of the ch 3 to join. Cut A – 17 dc.

Rnd 2: With B ch 3, work a **puff stitch** in each stitch around, you should have 17 total. Sl st into the top ch of ch-3 to join. Cut B – 16 puff sts and 1 hdc.

Rnd 3: With C, ch 3, work a **cluster st** in each ch-1 sp around, sl st into the top ch of ch-3 to join. Cut C – 17 cluster sts.

Rnd 4: With D, ch 3, work a **cluster st** in each ch-1 sp around (making sure to ch 3 to complete each cluster this round instead of ch 2), ch 3. Sl st into the top ch of ch 3 to join. Cut D – 17 cluster sts.

Rnd 5: Attach B in any ch sp, *sc around same ch sp, ch 2, insert hk into the top of the cluster stitch directly below from Rnd 3, sl st, ch 2, sl st in ch sp you first worked a sc in. (*You should see a "V" shape forming*). Sl st into next 2 sts*; rep from * 17 more times. Sc around the same ch in the first ch sp you began in to join. Cut B – 17 v's.

Rnd 6: With A, attach yarn in a ch sp in the center of any "V", *ch 4, sl st in same sp, ch 1, dc into the back loop of next 2 sts, ch 1 (this creates a picot)*; rep from * 16 more times. Sl st into beginning st of rnd to join. Cut A – 17 picots.

Starburst Mandala Satchel

For Rnd 7, you will be working on the WS of the mandala, working through the front loops. When viewed from the RS, the sts in this rnd will sit behind the mandala, so that the mandala sit on top.

Rnd 7 (WS): Attach D in any ch sp, ch 3, *make 5 dc flo in next st, sk 2 sts*; repeat from * to complete the entire rnd. Sl st into the top ch of the ch-3 to join. Cut D. *(You may sk more than 2 spaces between dcs if you notice it's starting to ruffle and not sit flat).*

Rnd 8 (RS): With C, sc around entire rnd and sl st with first sc to join.

STRAP

With larger (5.5 mm) hk and C, ch 11.

Row 1 (RS): Dc into 5th ch from hk, dc in next 6 chs. Turn.

Row 2 (WS): Ch 7, sc into ch 3 of previous row. Turn.

Row 3: Ch 3, make 6 dc around ch, dc into last st. Turn.

Rows 4-35: Rep Rows 2 and 3 32 more times.

Now, you will continue working around the bottom of the mandalas, attaching them together to create the bottom of the satchel until you meet the other end of the strap on the opposite side.

Row 36: 7 Sc, turn.

Rows 37-94: Rep Row 36 58 more times. Sl st both ends of strap together.

Sc strap to edges of the mandalas to attach and form the satchel, making sure to leave an opening of approx. 28 stiches on both sides and attaching the sc portion of the strap to the mandalas. With C, sl st in stitches along opening of satchel to reinforce the area.

CLOSURE

Loop

With smaller (4 mm) hk and C, ch 20 and sl st to first ch to join ends. Draw the joined end of the loop through a st space at the top center of a mandala towards the inside of the satchel so that the rest of the loop hangs from the opposite side. Sew the end of the loop into place on the inside of the satchel.

Button

With smaller (4 mm) hk and D, form a **Magic Ring**. Ch 1.

Rnd 1: 5 sc into loop, pull tail to close loop of magic ring. Sl st into the 1st sc to join, ch 1.

Rnd 2: Sc into the same sc with sl st, sc twice into each st, sl st into the 1st sc to join.

Sew the button to the front of the 2nd mandala in the top center so that it sits over the rnd of D. You should be able to pull the loop you created around the button as a closure for the satchel.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.

- #ED100-21 Magenta – 1 (1, 1, 1) ball
- #ED100-17 Azure – 1 (1, 1, 1) ball
- #ED100-22 Bittersweet – 1 (1, 1, 1) ball
- #ED100-07 Really Red – 1 (1, 1, 1) ball
- #ED100-28 Mustard – 1 (1, 1, 1) ball
- #ED100-01 Snow White – 3 (3, 4, 4) balls

Hook: US Size H8 (5 mm) crochet hook *or size needed to obtain gauge*

Notions: Tapestry needle

GAUGE

14 sts x 8 rows = 4" in dc st

Save time, check your gauge.

STITCH GUIDE

Bobble Stitch: Yo, insert hk into the center ring, yo, draw through, yo, pull through 2 loops. Yo, insert hk into ring center again, yo, draw through, yo, pull through 2 loops, yo, pull through all 3 loops.

PATTERN NOTES

The pattern colors Mustard, Azure, Really Red, Bittersweet and Magenta will be used to make flower portion of the granny squares. You may choose whatever combination of these colors you would like to make your granny squares with, using 1 color for Rnd 1 and another color for Rnd 2.

According to the size you are making, you will make a total of:

Small: 10 granny squares

Medium: 11 granny squares

Large: 12 granny squares

X-Large: 13 granny squares

Flower Granny Squares

Ch 4 and join with sl st.

Rnd 1 (RS): Ch 3, 1 dc in center of ring, ch 1 (counts as first bobble st). * Make 1 bobble stitch, ch 1, repeat from * 6 more times (for a total of 8 bobble sts). Sl st into the 3rd chain of your first ch-3 to join.

Rnd 2: With next color you will be working in between the bobble sts through the ch-1 sp. Ch 3 (counts as 1 dc), 2 dc in same sp, ch 1. *Work 3 dc into next space, ch 1. Rep from (*) 6 more times for a total of 8 dc clusters. Sl st into the 3rd chain of the first ch-3 to join.

Rep Rows 1-2 for patt.

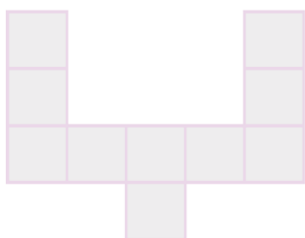

Rnd 3: With Snow White, you will be working into the ch-1 spaces between the 3dc clusters. Ch 4, into the same space work 3 dc, ch 1 (This will form the first corner of your granny square). 3 dc in next sp, ch 1, (this forms a side of your square). Work 3 dc, ch 2, 3dc, ch 1, in next space (forms second corner). 3 dc, ch 1 in next sp. 3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc, ch 1 in next sp. 3 dc, ch 1, in next sp. 3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc, ch 1 in next sp. 3 dc, ch 1 in next sp. 2 dc into the first space worked in rnd 4, sl st into 3rd chain of initial ch 3. Cut Snow White. *Rep steps from rnds 1-3 to make 9 (10, 11, 12) more granny squares.*

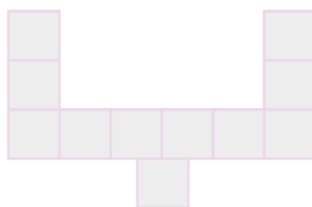
Single Crochet granny squares together as the diagrams show:

Note: For Sizes Small and Large you will attach the bottom square directly under the center square and for Sizes Medium and Extra Large you will attach the bottom square in between the two center squares (shown in diagrams).

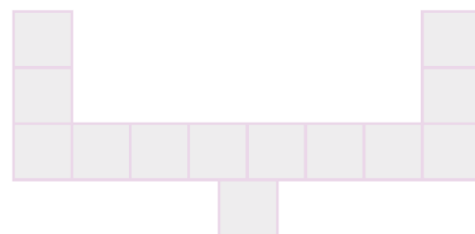

The rest of the blouse will be built by crocheting along the bottom edge of the granny squares to form the front of the blouse and along the top of the granny squares to form the back.

Front Side

Row 1: Attach Snow White to outer edge of granny square and dc across (for size Small & Medium: every 5 dc sts make 3 dc in the same st, and for Sizes Large & Extra Large increase to 3 dc every 4 or 3 dc sts across) when you reach the edge of the middle granny square sl st into square to join to a stitch at the same height as dc.

Row 2: Turn, make 1 dc, sl st to join with granny square again, dc in each st across row.

Row 3: Turn, 1 dc in each dc across, when you reach the edge of the middle granny square sl st to join to a stitch at the same height as dc.

Row 4: Turn, make 1 dc, sl st to join with granny square again, dc in each st across row.

Row 5: Turn, 1 dc in each dc across, when you reach the edge of the middle granny square sl st to join to a stitch at the same height as dc. Now your 5 rows of dc should be level with the bottom edge of the center granny square. Cut and fasten off.

Repeat Rows 1-5 on the other side of the granny square.

Now that the bottom edge is level along the front of your blouse, using Snow White, dc until your piece measures 4" from your desired length or until your piece measures 18" (19", 20", 21").

**Optional- This design is meant to fit loosely but if you feel like you want a tighter fit, after about Row 14 of dc on the front of the blouse you can begin to decrease a st or 2 in each row to achieve a closer fit below the bust.*

For size Small, I worked 16 rows of dc.

Once you've reached your desired length, work the **Bottom Edge Stripe Sequence** as follows:

Bottom Edge Stripe Sequence

Row 1: With Bittersweet work 1 dc in each dc across row.

Row 2: Turn, with Snow White 1 sc in each dc across row.

Row 3: Turn, with Azure 1 dc in each sc across row.

Row 4: Turn, with Snow White 1 sc in each dc across row.

Row 5: Turn, with Magenta 1 dc in each sc across row.

Row 6: Turn, with Snow White 1 sc in each dc across row.

Row 7: Turn, with Mustard 1 dc in each sc across row.

Row 8-9: Turn, with Snow White 1 dc in each dc across row.

Row 10: Turn, sl st in each dc across row. Fasten off.

Back Side

On the back side of the blouse, with Snow White, attach the yarn to the bottom inner corner of the top left granny square. Ch 35(47, 59, 71) , slip stitch to bottom inner corner of the top right granny square to join. This links the gap between the 2 granny squares that will help form the back of the blouse.

Row 1: With Snow White, attach to outer edge of granny square, work 1 dc in each st across row.

Row 2: Turn, work 1 dc in each dc across.

Now, with Snow White, dc until you reach the same length in which you worked the front.

Once you've reached the same length as the front, work the **Bottom Edge Stripe Sequence** on the back piece.

Ruffle Sleeve

With Snow White attach the yarn to the edge of the lower right granny square on the front of the blouse. You will be working along the outer edge of the sleeve.

Row 1: Sl st into next 3 sts, sc into next 5 sts, hdc into next 4 sts, dc into next 33 sts

Hdc into next 2 sts, sc into next 3 sts, sl st into next 2 sts.

Row 2: Turn, sl st into next 4 sts, sc into next 3 sts, hdc into next 6 sts, dc into next 17 sts, hdc into next 3 sts, sc into next 7 sts, sl st into next 11 sts. Fasten off.

Repeat on opposite sleeve.

FINISHING

With Magenta, sc around entire neckline to add a pop of color around the collar.

Turn garment inside out with right sides together and sew the sides of the blouse together, leaving enough room at the top under the sleeve for armholes.

Weave in ends.
