## MAKING A TEMPLATE



Rustle together some cardboard or paper big enough for your frame. You will need scissors and a felt tip pen. Tape is optional.


At this point you will need a bike, or anything else that you want to put a bag on. It is best to remove any bottle cages or other items that will get in the way.



Now you need to hold your paper up to the frame. This is where the tape comes in handy.

Get your pen and trace around the inside of the frame, be careful not to move the paper. Mark any cable stops and bottle bosses. Also mark anything that may get in the way of the bag - if you have a front deraileur then I need to know. Once you have traced the frame sit back and check it looks okay.





Cut the template out using the scisors. It pays to cut outside of the line you have drawn, it's easy to take more off but harder to put it back on!

Place the template back into the frame and check for size, It should be a snug fit. If there are gaps bigger than 5mm then it is worth noting.
