On her involvement in *The Immigrant Cookbook*: “The project really spoke to me because of the Trump administration’s hostile legislation and rhetoric against immigrants that have been brewing this past year. Having immigrated at the age of 7 years old to L.A. from South Korea, I recall going to ESL class to learn English with fellow immigrant kids from Mexico. I learned to sing ‘This Land Is Your Land’ and felt a powerful connection to this multicultural country through that symbolic song of one United States. In 2009, when I began my business, I was inspired by the Obama administration to foster multiculturalism and celebrate immigrants. I wrote *The Kimchi Cookbook* in 2012 to demystify kimchi and share its long tradition as a handcrafted, fermented health food that belongs in the ranks of fine wine, cheese, and beer making.”
