The Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) (Year A)

The Catechism on the Mystery of Eucharist

The Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life." ... For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely *Christ himself*, our Pasch." (CCC 1324)

Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14-16—The Miraculous Manna in the Desert

- 1. <u>The Exodus</u>: Why "Forty Years in the Desert"? So that he might "humble" you (v. 2)
- 2. The Manna: Why? So that Israel would learn
 - a. "Man does not live by *bread* alone, but..."
 - b. "Man lives by every word that proceeds out of the mouth of the Lord"
- 3. Miraculous Food and Drink:
 - a. Paralleled with the "water" from the "flinty rock" (8:15)
 - b. The fathers "did not know" the manna

Psalm 147—God Feeds You with Finest Wheat

- 1. "Praise the LORD, O Jerusalem!" (Psalm 147:12; cf. Sequence before Alleluia)
- 2. "He fills you with the finest of the wheat" (147:14)

1 Corinthians 10:16-17—A Communion in the Body and Blood of Christ

- 1. Cup of Blessing: a "participation" (Greek koinōnia) in the "blood of Christ"
- 2. Bread Broken: a "participation" (Greek *koinōnia*) in the "body of Christ"

John 6:51-58—Jesus and the New Manna from Heaven

- 1. <u>Jesus Himself</u>: "I am the living bread which came down from heaven..." (6:51)
- 2. His Flesh and Blood: is "true food" and "true drink" (6:55)
- 3. New Manna: not like the old manna; whoever "eats" this will "liver forever" (6:58)

Sequence: Lauda Sion (Sung Optionally before the Alleluia)

Lo! the angel's food is given To the pilgrim who has striven; See *the children's bread from heaven*, which on dogs may not be spent.

Truth the ancient types fulfilling, Isaac bound, a victim willing, Paschal lamb, its lifeblood spilling, manna to the fathers sent.

Very bread, good shepherd, tend us,

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Jesus, of your love befriend us, You refresh us, you defend us, Your eternal goodness send us, In the land of life to see...
